April 10, 2006
6:00 PM, Olin Theater

I. Speaker

Mr. Sam Walker, along with two dining service managers, spoke at the meeting. Mr. Walker explained that a meeting concerning renovations and improvements on Zach's would be held this week. He also discussed the idea of setting up a separate meal plan for the students who live in the new apartments. Mr. Walker asked for suggestions concerning food services. The suggestions from the Assembly included square pizza in Burwell, boneless grilled chicken in Burwell, jello as dessert option in Burwell, later dinner hours in Burwell, publishing Zach's specials, and opening Zach's earlier on Sundays. Mr. Walker explained that they are in the process of hiring a new baker who would start next fall. He also reminded the Assembly, after being asked about late night breakfast, that Zach's serves breakfast on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights from 11 am to 1 pm., Mr. Walker also encouraged the assembly to let him know if there was anything else he could do to improve dining services

II. Call to Order

President Fast called the meeting to order.

III. Invocation

Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.

IV. Historian's Remark

Ms. Smith gave the historian's remarks concerning the great food riot at Wofford due to hotdogs being served three times in one week.

V. Approval of the Minutes

The minutes were approved as emailed by Secretary Glasgow.

VI. Roll Call

Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VII. Officer Reports

a. Secretary

Secretary Glasgow explained that each delegate should have received an attendance update. She encouraged the delegates to let her know if they thought

there was a mistake with their attendance records. Secretary Glasgow announced that Campus Union will sponsor a booth during Terrier Playday, which will be held April 29 from noon-4 pm. She explained that a sign up sheet was going around and encouraged all delegates to sign up. Secretary Glasgow also pointed out that each delegate had been given a copy of the Campus Union Constitution, and therefore, they should all become familiar with its contents.

VIII. Committee Reports

a. Executive

Vice President Albergotti explained that there is a Campus Union subfolder in the Wofford Public Folders. She added that the minutes, agendas, proposal, and all other relevant Campus Union information will be view-only for the entire campus. She encouraged the delegates to use the Public Folder weekly.

b. Elections & Nominations

Vice President Albergotti had nothing to report.

c. Financial Affairs Committee

Treasurer Langley explained that there is currently about \$5000 left in the budget. This total came about after adding the amount not used last semester. He also told the Assembly that the next FAC meeting will be held Thursday at 11am.

d. Campus Relations

Ms. Hall reported to the Assembly concerning the Faculty and Staff Luncheon, which is scheduled for April 18 from 11am to 1 pm on the Lawn on Olin. She also told the Assembly that the next CRC meeting will be held on Thursday at 12pm in the Game Room.

e. Facility Affairs

Mr. Springs announced that the computers in Milliken will have internet capabilities by the end of the week. He also explained that a message board will be set up soon. In addition, Mr. Springs asked for suggests of where to place additional computers be emailed to him.

f. Wofford Activities Council

Ms. Ruthsatz reported that that Spring Weekend will be April 20-22. She explained that volleyball tournament sign ups will be held in Burwell soon. Ms. Ruthsatz also reported that Edwin McCain tickets will go on sale tomorrow, Tuesday April 11, in Student Affairs. She explained that students can buy two tickets on Tuesday for \$10 each otherwise, they will only be allowed to purchase one for \$10. In addition, she reported that the next WAC meeting will be Thursday at noon in McMillan. Vice President Albergotti asked which bands would be playing for Spring Weekend. Ms. Ruthsatz thought for a moment, only remembering Papa Soul at the time, and said she would get back to Vice President Albergotti concerning the names' of the bands.

g. Fun Funds

Mr. Madigan announced that Fun Funds was still interested in receiving proposals.

IX. Old Business

There was no old business.

X. New Business

a. Ms. Smith made a motion to consider the proposal for financing the distribution of water bottles to students. The motion was seconded and Ms. Smith read the proposal. The floor was opened for debate. Ms. Smith explained that she believed this would be a great opportunity to promote Campus Union. She said that a sign up sheet would be passed around and delegates could sign up for slot time. Mr. Crowe asked if there was a way something could be written and given out to students explaining what exactly Campus Union has been doing recently. Treasurer Langley explained to the Assembly that the Facilities Affairs Committee approved this proposal. Mr. Dekoster asked if the water bottle would be given out during a random morning, or if a day had been set. Ms. Smith explained that a date had no been set but the hope was to possibly hand out water monthly. Mr. Madigan asked when the water bottle would be handed out. Ms. Smith explained that she was not certain. Mr. Baylis suggested handing the water out during the afternoon instead of the morning. Ms. Smith explained that Mr. Baylis could offer a friendly amendment. Mr. Baylis offered a friendly amendment to pass the water out during the afternoon. Ms. Smith declined the amendment. Treasurer Langley moved to suspend the rules. President Fast explained that Tuesday and Thursday would work because people do not have morning classes. Mr. Madigan suggested Friday morning. Treasurer Langley suggested that the Assembly just try one day and if it does not work, the assembly can try a different day. Mr. Crowe attempted to offer a friendly amendment, but President Fast reminded him that the rules must first be reinstated. President Fast then asked if the Assembly could manage to hand out the water on a Friday morning. Delegates who could help raised their hands and the conclusion was made that the Assembly could hand out water on a Friday. Mr. Madigan moved to reinstate the rules. Mr. Crowe offered a friendly amendment to include "as well as distributing a flyer promoting Campus Union endeavors and accomplishments" to the end of the therefore clause. Ms. Smith accepted. Dean Bigger made a point of order reminding the President that Ms. Smith must decline or accept Ms. Baylis's friendly amendment. President Fast said that Ms. Smith already declined the amendment. Dean Bigger also said that Mr. Baylis could offer a formal amendment. The debate was ended. Ms. Smith reread the proposal including the friendly amendment and the proposal passed.

b. Mr. Barth moved to consider the Proposal to Amend Article II, Section 3, Letter c of the Constitution to Allow Elections to be Held Earlier in the Fall Semester. The motion was seconded, and Mr. Barth read the proposal and opened the floor for debate. Mr. Barth yielded the floor to Vice President Albergotti. Vice President Albergotti explained that she thought this was a great proposal and it would allow freshman student to get involved sooner. Mr. Baylis explained that he thought that three weeks was not enough time for freshman to get to know each other. Mr. Wood said that he thought this period of time would give an unfair advantage to people who are more outgoing. Mr. Madigan explained that he did not want elections to be a popularity contest. Mr. Hinton explained that he thought that students who went to the Summit would have an unfair advantage. Mr. Baylis explained that he thought publicity would help but he still thinks that the students need more time to adjust to each other. Vice President Albergotti offered a friendly amendment to change the elections to the fourth week. Mr. Barth accepted the amendment. Treasurer Langley explained that he thought that either way the elections are sort of a popularity contest anyway. Mr. Crowe explained the by putting Campus

Union out there earlier more students would be interested because they would not be involved in other organizations. Secretary Glasgow stated that it is important to for the Assembly to think about how the Assembly would function without the freshman. Mr. Madigan moved to call the questions; the motion was seconded. Mr. Barth reread the proposal with the friendly amendment. The proposal passed.

XI. Parliamentarians Report

Mr. Hinton found the meeting to be in good order. However, he pointed out that the Assembly should remember to address the President when speaking. He also reminded the Assembly that they must vote to suspend the rules.

XII. Comments and Announcements

In addition to the comments and announcements found on the agenda, Ms. Ruthsatz stated that the bands for Spring Weekend were Papa Soul, Wreckless, and Fresh Air. Dean Bigger explained the details concerning the Sandor Teszler Award to be awarded April 20 at a convocation at 11am and the Honors Convocation to be held May 2 to honor seniors. Treasurer Langley reminded the Assembly about the allocation process, which will take place over the next few weeks. President Fast explained that a Dining Services meeting will be held on Tuesday at 4pm in the Raines Center. He is open to having some other delegates attend. He also invited the Assembly to have dinner at Wade's after the meeting. He also reminded the Assembly that they need to be careful when offering friendly amendments; the wording is very important. Ms. Johnson stated that the member of the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee had been chosen and she told the assembly who the members were.

XIII. Adjournment

Mr. Baylis moved to close the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

6:00 PM, Olin Theater

I. Speaker

Brian Lemere, the director of Residence Life, spoke to the Assembly. Mr. Lemere wished the Assembly Happy late Easter and good luck on exams. He explained the updates concerning the new housing for next year. He also stated that the lottery assignments should have gone out today; however, there have been some delays. Only some houses will be ready for the beginning of the fall and others will follow. There is no set timeline at this time. Mr. Lemere needs the Assembly's help to explain the housing issue. Late Wednesday another email will be sent out with an update on the situation. The first option will be to put the students, temporarily, in on campus housing until the houses are finished. Students, who requested the new housing, could also be housed off campus, but he is unsure of the exact location. April 27 is the lasted for the final word concerning the housing. Mr. Lemere asked if anyone on the Assembly lived in Wightman; however, no one did, and he thanked the Assembly for their help.

VI. Roll Call

Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VII. Officer Reports

a. Secretary

Secretary Glasgow pointed out that everyone received an Easter treat bag from the cabinet and she encouraged everyone to enjoy the candy during the meeting. In addition, Secretary Glasgow passed around the Terrier Play Day sign up sheet

and encouraged all delegates to sign up for a time. She also explained that Campus Union minutes, agendas, proposal, and all other relative information would be posted in the Campus Union subfolder of Wofford's Public Folders. Lastly, Secretary Glasgow reminded the Assembly to send proposals to CampusUnion@wofford.edu so that the entire cabinet will have access to the information. The report was accepted as information.

VIII. Committee Reports

a. Executive

Vice President Albergotti welcomed Dr. Andrews and Dr. Wallace from the Economics department. She also spoke on behalf of President Dunlap concerning the Sandor Teszler Award, which will be given at a convocation, which will be held Thursday at 11am on the Lawn of Olin. She then asked for unanimous consent to approve the Campus Union standing committees as they are now. There were no objections. In addition, she moved for unanimous consent to approve next election dates. With no objection, the dates of elections on September 27, petitions available on September 18 and Petitions due on September 25 were accepted. The report was accepted as information.

b. Elections & Nominations

Vice President Albergotti opened the floor for nominations for the Faculty Member of the Year Award. Dean Bigger explained the election process. She stated that the student body will get to vote on the nominations and then the award will be given to the Faculty member receiving the most votes from the student body. Vice President Albergotti stated who the winners over the past three years were because those Faculty Members cannot receive the award this year. Mr. Madigan nominated Dr. Frank Machovec. Mr. Baylis nominated Dr. Deno Trakas. Mr. Montgomery nominated Dr. Philip Swicegood. Dr. John Lane, Dr. Amy Sweitzer, Mr. Conner nominated Dr. Dunson. Ms. McClain nominated Dr. Lefebvre. Mr. McClain nominated Dr. Arrington. All of these nominees will go on the ballot and the floor was closed for nominations. Vice President Albergotti opened the floor for nominations for the Staff Member of the Year Award. Treasurer Langley nominated Ms. Thomas from Student Affairs. Mr. Madigan nominated Ms. Quinn, the Registrar. Mr. Baylis nominated Mr. Chris who is the fourth floor janitor in Marsh Hall. Mr. Wood nominated Ms. Cathy. Ms. Ahmed nominated Ms. Diana from Milliken. Mr. McGill nominated Mr. Eric who is the manager of Zach's. The report was accepted as information.

c. Financial Affairs Committee

Treasurer Langley explained the the allocation process has started for the fall and next interim. He encouraged the delegates to let others know. He added that interviews would be held this week. He reminded the Assembly that there is still money in the general fund. In addition, he added that the discount card process would start at the end of this week. The report was accepted as information.

d. Campus Relations

Ms. Hall reported to the Assembly concerning the Faculty and Staff Luncheon, which is scheduled for April 18 from 11am to 1 pm on the Lawn on Olin. She also told the Assembly that the next CRC meeting would be held on Thursday at 12pm in the Game Room. The report was accepted as information.

e. Facility Affairs

Mr. Springs reported that Old Main will be completed by November 1 and that Leonard Auditorium would be completed by the end of the month. Mr. Baylis asked if the internet was working on the computers in Milliken. Mr. Springs confirmed that the internet should be working. Dean Bigger suggested that a computer be placed in the fitness center. The report was accepted as information.

f. Wofford Activities Council

Ms. Ruthsatz explained that Spring Weekend is this weekend, and there is a flyer in everyone's CPO explaining the details. She explained the details of the weekend, which included band parties each night, a shaving cream fight on Friday afternoon, and a volleyball tournament on Saturday afternoon. She added that burgers would be served that Saturday afternoon during the tournament. In addition, T-shirts are being sold in Burwell this week. Ms. Ruthsatz added that tickets for Edwin McCain would be sold outside of Burwell this Wednesday. Vice President Albergotti asked if there would be a limited number of koozies and cups handed out during the weekend. Ms. Ruthsatz confirmed that there would be a limited number. Ms. Ahmed asked who decides when spring weekend will be. Ms. Ruthsatz responded saying that to her knowledge a college committee sets the dates. Dean Bigger added that the dates are basically set for WAC because they have to consider the other things on the calendar including Terrier Play Day, Easter, and Spring Break. However, she added that Spring Weekend is later than normal this year. The report was accepted as information.

g. Fun Funds

Mr. Madigan announced that there would be a Sand Lot party this weekend. He explained that it is "growing time" for the committee at this time. He encouraged the Assembly to present proposals now for next fall, and asked them to pass the word to other students. The report was accepted as information.

h. Planning Activities Committee

Secretary Glasgow explained that the first meeting was held today. She added that a calendar should be up by next week including the events to be held for the remainder of the semester. She explained that the committee would not meet again until the fall. The report was accepted as information.

IX. Old Business

- a. Mr. Barth re-read the "therefore" clause of the Proposal to Amend Article II, Section 3, Letter c of the Constitution to Allow Elections to be Held Earlier in the Fall Semester. Dean Bigger made a point of order to correct the proposal to read the "4th week" as amendment during the previous meeting. The point of order was accepted.

X. New Business

- a. Mr. Conner read the Proposal for Funding for Wofford SERFS (Student Environmental Resource for Sustainability). The floor was opened for debate. Mr. Conner yielded the floor to Treasurer Langley. Treasurer Langley explained that the proposal was approved by the Financial Affairs Committee. Mr. Dekoster asked where the lot was located. Dean Bigger explained that it is located on McDowell Street. The floor was closed for debate. Mr. Conner re-read the “therefore” clause. The proposal was passed.
- b. Ms. Hall read Proposal to Allow CRC to Fund the Faculty/Staff Appreciation Luncheon. Floor was opened for debate. Ms. Hall explained that CRC has spent a lot of time on this event. Treasurer Langley pointed out that these funds are coming out of the CRC budget. Ms. Smith asked if the Assembly was invited or required to attend this event. Ms. Hall stated that it would be nice if everyone stopped by, but it was not required. Vice President Albergotti asked if there would be enough food for everyone to eat. Ms. Hall said yes. The floor was closed for debate; the “therefore” clause was re-read, and the proposal was passed.
- c. Mr. McGill read the Proposal for Funding for Wofford Souljahs For Christ (SFC). Floor was opened for debate. Mr. McGill yielded the floor to Treasurer Langley. Treasurer Langley pointed out that the event was successful last year and that the Financial Affairs Committee partially approved the proposal. Treasurer Langley offered a friendly amendment to change the “therefore” clause to read as follows: “THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT \$600.00 be given to Souljahs For Christ to help meet expenses. Mr. McGill accepted the amendment, and the floor was closed for debate. Mr. McGill reread the therefore clause with the friendly amendment and the proposal was passed.
- d. Mr. Dekoster read the Proposal to Help Fund the Ultimate Frisbee Team. The floor was opened for debate. He then yielded the floor to Mr. Matt Watts. However, Treasurer Langley added that the Financial Affairs Committee only approved \$160 for the proposal, so he offered a friendly amendment allowing the therefore clause to read “THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by that Campus Union Assembly of Wofford College that \$160 (6*\$25 plus tax for the jerseys) be given to the Ultimate Frisbee team. Mr. Dekoster accepted the friendly amendment and the floor was closed for debate. Mr. Dekoster re-read the therefore clause, and the proposal was passed.
- e. Mr. Montgomery read the Proposal to Help Fund Terrier PlayDay. The floor was opened for debate. Mr. Montgomery stated that Campus Union usually helps with Terrier PlayDay. The floor was then closed for debate. Mr. Montgomery re-read the therefore clause, and the proposal was passed.

I. Dean Bigger gave a Judicial Report. She explained that the report will be in the Old Gold and Black and included sixty alcohol violations. Forty-nine of the violations were first offense category one. Other violations included second offense category one; third offense category one; category two alcohol (3); false identification card (2); drug cases (2); organization cases (2). Dean Bigger stated that she intends to keep the Assembly more informed of the Judicial Report throughout the next semester.

II. President Fast called the meeting to order.

III. Mr. Crowe gave the Invocation.

IV. Ms. Smith gave the Historian's Remarks concerning Old Main.

V. The minutes were approved by the Assembly.

VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VII. Officer Reports

Secretary Glasgow explained that because it was nearing the end of the semester, the Cabinet thought it would be helpful to evaluate the past semester. She explained that the evaluation had been posted in the Public Folders and should have been completed and brought to the meeting. She stated that if a delegate was unable to obtain the copy from the Public Folders, she would be glad to give him/her a copy. Also, she explained the details of Terrier Play Day and Delta, Delta, Delta's Triple Play Contest. In addition, she passed a sign up sheet around for delegates to sign up to distribute water on Friday morning.

VIII. Committee Reports

Vice President Albergotti gave the Executive report welcoming the Assembly back from Spring Weekend. She also stated that the cabinet thinks the Assembly is doing a great job.

Vice President Albergotti stated that the printers in Milliken should be working soon.

Ms. Gaylord, reporting for Wofford Activities Council, thanked the Assembly for participating in Spring Weekend and encouraged everyone to attend the Edwin McCain concert on Thursday. She noted that a daily announcement would be sent out with details. In addition, she announced that May Day Play Day, a Terrier Play Day for Wofford students, would be held May 3. The next WAC meeting will be held Thursday at 12 pm in McMillan. Dean Bigger noted that Edwin McCain tickets would be sold at the gate.

Reporting for Fun Funds, Mr. Madigan explained that the Sandlot Party was held this past weekend and was a Fun Funds funded event. He also explained that evaluations were appreciated and welcomed.

Ms. Johnson reported concerning the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee. She stated that the committee's first meeting was Tuesday. The ideas discussed at the meeting included: spirit tunnel, student tailgate, dress up game days, terrier bucks, picnics at games, etc.

Secretary Glasgow reported that the Planning Activities Committee would not meet again this semester, but that the calendars should be up this week.

IX. There was no old business.

X. New Business included the following:

Mr. Madigan made a motion to consider the proposal for Wofford's Chapter of Sigma Delta Pi, the Spanish Honor Society. The motion was seconded, read, and the floor was opened for debate. Mr. Madigan stated that he was presenting this proposal on behalf of Dr. Akers, and he believed that this event would be good for the college community. Treasurer Langley stated that the proposal had been approved by the Financial Affairs Committee. Mr. Madigan moved to close the floor and the motion was seconded. Mr. Madigan reread the "therefore" clause. The Assembly voted on the proposal and it was passed.

Mr. Bryan made a motion to consider the proposal to distribute the Remaining Allocated Funds to South Carolina Student Legislature. Mr. Bryan stated that the organization wanted to be reimbursed for expenses. Treasurer Langley explained that the money has already been accounted for and allocated and the organization was just asking to use it in another form. Mr. Bryan moved to closed the floor and the motion was seconded. Mr. Bryan reread the "therefore" clause and the proposal was passed after voting.

Mr. DeKoster made a motion to consider the proposal to distribute the Remaining Allocated Funds to the Club Ultimate Frisbee Team. Mr. DeKoster explained that the money had already been allocated. Treasurer Langley stated that this proposal was similar to the last one in that the organization was asking to use the allocated funds at their discretion. Ms. Hall thanked those would helped clean up after the Faculty and Staff Appreciation luncheon. President Fast explained that Ms. Hall was the Delegate of the Month for April and reminded the Assembly that Mr. Madigan was the Delegate of the Month for March. Both Mr. Madigan and Ms. Hall were presented with certificates. Mr. Baylis asked Treasurer Langley when the contracts were due back. Mr. Wilkes Brown asked how exactly the contracts worked. Treasurer Langley explained that the discount cards information are due back next week. He also explained the process and encouraged the delegates to get new businesses to become part of the discount card. He asked the delegates to email him if they had questions.
