- I. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.
- III. Mr. Brian Lemere, the director of Residence Life, spoke to the Assembly. He discussed the lottery system. The lottery system is based totally on credit hours and at this time, the dates are tentative. The Assembly also discussed the issue of housing for freshman next year.
- IV. Ms. Smith gave the Historian's Remark regarding Wofford's Endowment.
- V. The minutes were approved as presented.
- VI. The agenda was approved as presented.
- VII. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VIII. Officer Reports

**Proposal to Amend the Campus Union By-Laws to Include a Clause for Mandatory Proposals  
Proposed by: Josh Thompson, Campus Union Senior Delegate**

**Whereas,**

1. Each member of the Campus Union assembly has a duty to be proactive in voicing the opinions of his or her fellow students.
2. This is best done through general proposals, the ideas for which are always in abundance, and the proper format and aid for drafting such proposals readily being available from the Executive Council or senior members of the Assembly.
3. The 2006-2007 Assembly has seen the response from and importance placed on the proposals it has passed and hopes to leave a legacy that will continue to strengthen both the voices of Campus Union and the student body at large.
4. The best way to ensure that proposals continue to flow forward in future assemblies is to mandate delegates' participation in drafting and presenting such proposals.

**Therefore, be it resolved,**

That the Campus Union approve the following addition to the Campus Union by-laws which require each delegate to present two proposals to the Campus Union assembly per each individual's term of service.

**Article 2. The Campus Union Assembly**

**Section 5. Duties and Powers of the Assembly**

*F, Part 9: A.* Each delegate shall be required to propose two proposals to the Assembly per each individual's term of service.

*B.* It shall be the duty of the campus Union Secretary and the Executive Committee, at large, to keep record of and enforce Assembly members' work in making their required proposals.

*C.* If a delegate fails to produce his or her required proposals, in accordance with the guidelines specified by the Executive Committee, the Elections and Nominations Committee shall deem the appropriate actions that should be taken in reaction to the delegates' violations.

**Proposal to Make Recommendations about the Current Interim Lottery System  
Proposed by: Josh Thompson, Campus Union Senior Delegate**

***Whereas,***

1. Interim is an important part of a Wofford education and each student should have the ability to choose interim programs that would most benefit them during each of their four years at Wofford.
2. Currently, seniors maintain seniority by being assigned a certain time allotment to register for classes, but there is no seniority status given to the junior, sophomore, and freshman classes respectively. This means that the same student could receive an exceptionally good or bad number all three of their underclassman years that may impede their ability to choose their interim programming according to their interest as a student.
3. This problem could be best and most justly alleviated if a seniority clause for each class was put into place, giving seniors a certain time allotment among their own class, then assigning juniors a certain time allotment within their own class, then to sophomores, and, lastly, to freshmen in like manner.
4. The timeline between independent proposal application and acceptance dates and general registration greatly conflicts, often limiting students whose independent proposals are turned down from being able to best explore other options, such as travel trips, before these travel trip applications and deposits are due.
5. Other such minor improvements to the interim selection system could be highly beneficial to the interim experience.

***Therefore, be it resolved:***

That the Campus Union recommend to the proper administrative authorities that:

- A. The interim system be redefined to establish the above seniority-based system within each class based upon hours, giving seniors the proper sign-up time before juniors, juniors the proper seniority over sophomores, etc.
- B. That independent interim proposal information be mailed out over the summer and be due earlier so that those who are interested in this have more time to properly gather information and put together their proposals. They would therefore have adequate time, if their proposals are turned down, to fully explore other options before application and deposit due dates expire.
- C. That the opportunities for interim scholarship moneys be better advertised and prominent, so each student will have equal and proper information on these opportunities.
- D. That interim travel meetings be held before scholarship information is due so that those who may gain interest after attending an interim informational meeting have time to properly apply for interim scholarships.
- E. That the procedures pertaining to refunds and whether or not one can change interims after one is picked up for a certain interim be described on the Wofford interim website under a FAQ menu.

February 26, 2006

- I. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Crowe gave the Invocation
- III. Ms. Smith gave the Historian's Remarks regarding the Hub City's writing project.
- IV. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. The agenda was approved as presented.
- VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VII. Officer Reports
  - a. Secretary Glasgow noted that the place and time of dinner next week would be emailed out.
- VIII. Committee Reports
  - a. The Executive Committee report was given by Vice President Albergotti; she congratulated the new cabinet for their election.
  - b. The Elections & Nominations report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She explained that delegate petitions are available starting today. She encouraged delegates to run again and to encourage others to run. She added that petitions are due this Friday and elections are next Wednesday with a run off on Thursday if needed. She then moved for nominations for the William Light Kenny, Jr. Award, which is awarded to the most outstanding freshman delegate. Mr. Prosser was nominated by Mr. Madigan; Ms. Newman was nominated by Mr. Bryan; Ms. Harris was nominated by Mr. Baylis. Voting was conducted and the winner will be announced next week. Nominations for the J. Michael Preston award, the most outstanding delegate award, were made. Mr. McClain nominated Mr. Madigan. Mr. Bryan nominated Mr. Thompson; however, he declined in interest of other candidates. Ms. Harris nominated Ms. Ruthsatz; however, she is not a voting member and therefore the nomination was declined. Secretary Glasgow nominated Ms. Johnson; Ms. Walker nominated Mr. Crowe; however, he declined in interest of other candidates. Voting was conducted and the winner will be announced next week. Dean Bigger added that judicial elections are Wednesday.

The Financial Affairs Committee report was given by Treasurer Langley. He congratulated Mr. Troxell on his election. Vice President Albergotti asked if Treasurer Langley could give an idea of the current budget. He responded that the budget is on course with about \$1500

extra dollars from last semester's allocated moneys not being spent. He added that there is about \$3200 in the general proposal fund.

c. The Campus Relations Committee report was given by Ms. Hall. She stated that the Student and Faculty Football Game would be held on April 16, 2007. In addition, she noted that the next meeting would be on Thursday at 11:30am in the Commons. Treasurer Langley asked if the game would be a tournament style event. Ms. Hall noted that the committee is looking into that idea. Mr. Crowe added that fraternities and sororities would not be playing in the game if the committee decides to change the layout of the game.

d. The Facility Affairs Committee report was given by Mr. Springs. He noted that the Bandwidth problem is due to the fact that Wofford has a limit that the campus must stay between. However, the amount has been expanded, but at this time, the college is not sure that it can be expanded any further. He added that sharing files with others slows the system down. He also noted that additional computers in Milliken would not come until the end of the semester or the summer. Mr. Madigan asked what was going on with the bike project. Mr. Springs answered saying that the with the extensive work with the apartments, the bike project been put aside for now; hopefully will come into play later he added.

e. The Wofford Activities Council report was given by Ms. Ruthsatz. She noted that WAC would sponsor a hypnotist on Wednesday, March 7. She added that the next meeting would be on Thursday at noon in McMillan.

f. The Fun Funds Committee report was given by Mr. Madigan. He noted that there are many new proposals coming through. In addition, he added that the committee is pointing some chartered organizations to the general proposal fund of Campus Union. He noted that there are possible events set for March 10 and April 14.

g. Secretary Glasgow had nothing to report for the Planning Activities Committee.

h. The Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee report was given by Ms. Johnson. She noted that the Furman game over the weekend was awesome. She added that the basketball tournament would be held this week in Charleston. Also, she is capable of getting free tickets for anyone who would like to attend the games. Furthermore, she noted that the games would be broadcasted on the athletic website.

#### IX. Board of Trustee Meeting Reports

a. The Athletics Board report was given by Ms. Johnson. She noted that the football program signed 19 new players and has a new strength coach. Also, she noted that the committee was aware that the women's basketball team is improving. She gave statistics related to the winning of different athletic teams. Ms. Johnson noted that the committee discussed the need for upgrading the weight room faculties. She added that Homecoming this fall would be on November 3, which is later than normal, and will be against Georgia Southern. Mr. Baylis asked if Wofford would be playing the University of South Carolina next fall. She answered with a no, but gave the full schedule to the Assembly.

b. Mr. Thompson reported on the Development Committee Meeting. He noted that the college had the best financial gain in 2006. He noted that there is an ongoing campaign to raise money; it should be completed by 2009 and the goal is to raise \$106 million. He added that the committee pointed out that the college's weakness is that professorship endowments are needed. Mr. Reeves began one with a generous \$75,000 donation. He noted that the committee believes that the Terrier Club donations have probably reached there peak. The committee believes that the Wofford on call program has been very beneficial since it began. He added that the committee discussed the idea of enhancing the Parents' Weekend festivities so that they are more like Homecoming.

- c. The Education Committee report was given by Secretary Glasgow. She explained that the committee discussed the personal property, patents and copyrights, rules and regulations that need to be set by the college. Also, she noted that two presentation related to the library were made to the committee. One was about the increased ease of use of the library's website and the other was concerning the Littlejohn project that Wofford is a part of. In addition, she added that the committee discussed the idea of a "financial imperatives class" for seniors.
- d. The Enrollment Committee report was given by Mr. Madigan. He noted that there would be an increase in tuition by 6%, making tuition \$35000. He added that Furman, Davidson, and Washington & Lee are over \$40000. Also, the next freshman class will hopefully consist of 410 people to continue the growth process. Mr. Wood asked where the money from increased tuition is going. Mr. Madigan noted that the money would be used in lots of places. Dean Bigger gave some specifics, which included funding the cost of living increase, 5 new professors, 2 new RAs for the village, athletic moneys, and fees with endowments. Mr. Prosser asked if there was any talk about increases in scholarships. Mr. Madigan said that this was talked about in the Student Life committee meeting.
- e. Ms. Smith was unable to attend the Evaluating-Planning-Marketing committee meeting due to her class schedule.
- f. The Facilities committee report was given by Mr. Bryan. He noted that he basically gave the report last week, but he added that there would be 180 beds in the village in fall, which will include adding gatehouses.
- g. The Finance Committee report was given by Treasurer Langley. He noted that there was some investment discussion, which included the fact that the college received a 15% return on endowment, making it over \$150 million now. He showed a graph to the Assembly concerning the fees of the college. Treasurer Langley said that the committee discussed the idea of tying tuition to scholarships; however, although the committee would like to do this, at this point, the college is not at a financial position to do so. Mr. Crowe noted that it is frustrating that tuition is increasing; however, he added that the Assembly should remember we do not live in a perfect world, so he encouraged the Assembly to keep thinking about these issues.
- h. Ms. Ahmed was unable to attend the Information Technology meeting.
- i. Vice President Albergotti gave the Student Life committee report. She noted that President Fast, Mr. Madigan, and Dean Bigger also attended this meeting. She added that the Campus Union accomplishments for the year were presented as well as the dreams for the future. She mentioned that the Board listened to the ideas presented and will keep our ideas in mind in the future. She added that a presentation about the pandemic flu was given. She noted that the Parents advisor council is looking for people to host off campus events before students come to Wofford College. Dean Bigger added that President Fast did a great job representing the Assembly and student body as a whole to entire board.

X. There was no Old Business to discuss.

XI. New Business

- a. Mr. Thompson moved to read the Proposal to Amend the Campus Union By-Laws to Include a Clause for Mandatory Proposals for its first reading. The proposal was read. The floor was closed for the first reading.

Mr. Thompson moved to open the floor for consideration of the proposal to make recommendations about the current interim lottery system; the motion was seconded and the proposal read. The floor was opened for debate. Mr. Thompson noted that once everyone signed up at the same time. However, he added that this is to allow all students to have a fair way of signing up for classes each year they are at Wofford. He noted that this system has the potential to benefit all; he added that the Assembly should remember that we want to help all students at Wofford. Furthermore, he explained that pieces of the proposal have to do with things other than the lottery system, but are just as important to the students. However, he pointed out that this is only a recommendation to the faculty. Mr. Crowe thanked Mr. Thompson for making the proposal; he added that he thinks that the structure is needed and that he fully supports this system. He added that as an underclassman, it seems logical that upperclassman should have precedence over this issue. Ms. Harris noted that freshman should have some preference. Mr. Thompson noted that sophomores and freshman should be able to get into any class as long as juniors and seniors have some priority. He explained that this proposal would really not impact him, because he is graduating. However, he noted that he does think that freshman should be allowed of experiences like travel trips, but they should be allowed to go if there are spots left open. He encouraged the Assembly to think of this proposal less as a putting freshman down for one year, but more as the fact that over the years, student will have an increasing priority. Ms. Harris asked if there should not be a compromise. She asked could we seniors have ultimate priority and can sophomores and freshman have priority together. Mr. Troxell noted that there is a misspelling in the whereas clause. Vice President Albergotti offered a friendly amendment to Section 1 for "there" to be spelled correctly; Mr. Thompson accepted the friendly amendment. Vice President Albergotti mentioned that it is a good point to looking out for freshmen and sophomores. However, she noted that this system is just like the housing lottery and people are generally happy with the outcome of housing because they can compare themselves to others and understand the reason for placements. Secretary Glasgow noted that from her personal experience the idea of letting all students sign up for interim at the same time could produce a psychological issue related to interim program. She noted that the ultimate goal should be for students to have a positive image of interim in the end of four years, which will not happen if underclassmen get precedence over seniors. Debate was ended; Mr. Thompson re-read the therefore clause. The Assembly voted and the proposal passed.

- XII. The Parliamentarian's Report was given by Mr. Thompson. He found the meeting to be in good order.
