Article 2. The Campus Union Assembly

Section 5. Duties and Powers of the Assembly

F, Part 9: A. Each delegate shall be required to propose two proposals to the Assembly per each individual's term of service.

B. It shall be the duty of the campus Union Secretary and the Executive Committee, at large, to keep record of and enforce Assembly members' work in making their required proposals.

C. If a delegate fails to produce his or her required proposals, in accordance with the guidelines specified by the Executive Committee, the Elections and Nominations Committee shall deem the appropriate actions that should be taken in reaction to the delegates' violations.

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Minutes from Campus Union Assembly Meeting
March 6, 2006
Olin Theater, 6:00pm

I. Speaker

Brian Lemere, Residence Life director, spoke concerning the current lottery system at Wofford. He stated that an email will be sent to all students with every detail concerning the lottery process and room selections. Every Wofford student's room deposit of \$300 is due to the business office on March 15, 2006. The room selection process will begin on Tuesday March 28, 2006 at 1pm and conclude Thursday March 30, 2006 at 11pm, and all room assignments will be made by April 17, 2006.

II. Call to Order

Ms. Boos called the meeting to order.

III. Oath of Office

Joseph Bias administered the Oath of Office to the four Campus Union officers and the Assembly. He expressed his excitement to serve on the Judicial Commission and wished the Assembly good luck in the upcoming year.

IV. Invocation :

Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.

V. Historian's Remark

Vice President Albergotti gave the Historian's Remarks explaining that the first South Carolina football game, a competition between the Furman Knights and the Wofford Terriers, was held at Wofford College.

VI. Roll Call: Secretary Glasgow

Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VII. Officer Reports

a. Secretary Glasgow

Secretary Glasgow passed around a directory information sheet for the delegates to fill in their personal information. She also explained the delegate contracts given to each delegate and encouraged the Assembly to take them seriously. Secretary Glasgow stated that she would copy the contracts and give each delegate a copy for his/her notebook at the next meeting. In addition, Secretary Glasgow explained the contents of the delegate notebooks. She

noted that the cabinet had written a letter to the delegates and it was included in the notebook along with hints for Robert's Rules of Order and the Campus Union Rules. Secretary Glasgow commented on how nicely dressed the assembly was and encouraged them to continue to abide by the dress code as each delegate is a representative of the college. Secretary Glasgow then stressed the attendance policy, stating that if a delegate accumulates 3 unexcused or 5 excused absences, he/she will be removed from the Assembly. Also, she explained that the absences carry over to the fall semester and 3 tardies to a meeting or early departures from a meeting will result in an absence.

VIII. Committee Reports

a. Executive

Vice President Albergotti welcomed and congratulated the new Assembly. She explained that Dean Bigger is the advisor for Campus Union and is open and willing to speak with each delegate. Vice President Albergotti stressed the importance of being committed to Campus Union and to the committees and responsibilities associated with the delegate offices. She also noted that next week's meeting will be informal and will be held in the Mungo Room which is at Gibb's Stadium. Vice President Albergotti asked for unanimous consent to make the Shuckin' and Shaggin' Fund Funs event on Thursday from 9pm-12am in front of Old Main mandatory for the Assembly. The motion passed without objection. She then asked for unanimous consent to move the Campus Union meeting scheduled for March 27 to 7:30pm due to the Student/ Faculty Football Game. The motion also passed without objection. Vice President Albergotti also asked for unanimous consent to make the Faculty/Student Football Game mandatory for the Assembly. This motion also passed without objection.

b. Elections & Nominations

Vice President Albergotti explained that during new business the Assembly will nominate and appoint the Chaplain, Historian, Parliamentarian, and the Elections and Nomination Committee Members. She also explained the responsibilities of the Elections and Nominations Committee members. In addition, Vice President Albergotti told the assembly that the applications for committee chairs are available in Student Affairs until Wednesday, March 8, 2006 and applications for committee membership will be available in Student Affairs on Friday March 10, 2006.

c. Financial Affairs Committee

Treasurer Langley encouraged the delegates to present proposals, and he explained that he was excited about working with the new financial affairs committee over the next year.

d. Campus Relations

Vice President Albergotti told the Assembly that the Student/ Faculty Football game will be held March 27, 2006 at 6pm.

e. Facility Affairs

Ms. Johnson stated that the construction on the new apartment living space will begin on March 15, 2006. She also explained that Old Main construction is partially complete.

f. Wofford Activities Council

Ms. Ruthsatz explained that the next WAC event will be Wacky Wednesday on March 15. Online evaluation will be conducted during this day.

Dean Bigger made a point of order reminding President Fast to ask for additions and corrections to committee reports. She then added that additional lightening will be put up in the admissions parking lot.

g. Fun Funds

Ms. Beacham announced the upcoming Fund Funs events, which included the following: Godzilla Says "Super Super Sushi bonsai Open Mic Night Ok Ready Lets Go" hosted by the Arts Living Learning Community on Monday, March 13; Shuckin' and Shaggin', featuring a Jimmy Buffett cover band and oyster roast, hosted by Campus Union on Thursday, March 10; and Drums entertainment, March 18, on the front lawn of Old Main – proposed by Dr. Heddis. Ms. Beacham also explained to the Assembly that everyone who proposes a Fund Funs event will be entered into a drawing to win \$500.

IX. Old Business

a. Second Reading of the Proposal to Amend Article 2 Section 1B of the Bylaws of the Wofford College Campus Union by Secretary Glasgow.

X. New Business

a. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations the position of Chaplain. Mr. Baylis nominated Mr. Crowe, while Ms. Johnson nominated Ms. Smith. The floor was closed for nominations and Mr. Crowe and Ms. Smith stepped out of the room. Mr. Baylis spoke on behalf of Mr. Crowe; Ms. Johnson spoke on behalf of Ms. Smith. The Assembly voted and Mr. Crowe was named the 2006-2007 Campus Union Chaplain. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations the position of Historian. Mr. Madigan nominated Ms. Cromer, while Mr. Wood nominated Ms. Smith. The floor was closed for nominations and Ms. Cromer and Ms. Smith stepped out of the room. Mr. Madigan spoke on behalf of Ms. Cromer; Mr. Wood spoke on behalf of Ms. Smith. The Assembly voted and Ms. Smith was named the 2006-2007 Campus Union Historian. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations the position of Parliamentarian. Mr. Madigan nominated Mr. Sean Hinton, while Ms. Smith nominated Mr. Wood. The floor was closed for nominations and Mr. Hinton and Mr. Wood stepped out of the room. Mr. Madigan encouraged the Assembly to consider Mr. Hinton, while Ms. Smith discouraged the Assembly from voting for Mr. Wood as he would have to forgo his voting rights if elected. The Assembly voted and Mr. Hinton was named the 2006-2007 Campus Union Parliamentarian. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations for the position of Senior class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee. Secretary Glasgow nominated Ms. Johnson. The floor was closed for nominations and Ms. Johnson was named the 2006-2007 Senior class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee. Dean Bigger then made a point of order explaining the responsibilities and obligations of the Elections and Nominations Committee. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations the position of Junior class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee. Mr. Oates nominated Mr. Madigan, while Mr. Conner nominated Mr. Dekoster. The floor was closed for nominations and Mr. Madigan and Mr. Dekoster stepped outside the room. The Assembly voted and Mr. Madigan was named the

2006-2007 Junior class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee. Vice President Albergotti moved to open the floor for nominations the position of Sophomore class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee. Mr. Crowe nominated Mr. Baylis. Then, Mr. Madigan nominated Mr. Bryan. The floor was closed for nominations and the Mr. Baylis and Mr. Bryan stepped outside of the room. The Assembly voted and Mr. Baylis was named the 2006-2007 Sophomore class representative to the Elections and Nominations Committee.

b. Mr. Madigan made a motion to consider the Proposal for Wofford College to look into the Fire Alarm Safety System within the residence Halls. The motion was seconded and Mr. Madigan read the proposal; the floor was then opened for debate. Mr. Madigan explained the need for a safer fire alarm system as the current system is not wired directly to the Fire Station. The questions were called; Mr. Madigan reread the proposal and the Assembly approved the proposal as presented.

XI. Parliamentarians Report

Ms. Boos found the meeting to be in good order considering it was the first meeting for the 2006-2007 Assembly. However, she reminded the delegates to stand when they speak and also to address the assembly through President Fast. Ms. Boos also stated that a motion must be seconded. She even commented that the camera man motioned for seconds throughout the meeting. Lastly, Ms. Boos wished the new Assembly good luck in their future endeavors.

XII. Comments and Announcements

Secretary Glasgow explained that there are some comments and announcements included on the agenda. Dean Bigger then congratulated the Assembly and reminded the Assembly to remember to say that they "I move to" not "I make a motion" when considering a proposal or making a motion of any kind. Vice President Albergotti explained that Dr. Doyle Boggs donated the t-shirts to the Assembly and encouraged the Assembly to see her after the meeting if they needed a different size t-shirt. President Fast explained that he is excited about the upcoming year.

I. Speaker:

As the Director of Sports Marketing for three years at Wofford, Lenny Mathis spoke to the Assembly concerning sporting events and school spirit at Wofford. Mr. Mathis was hired to try to encourage the average Spartanburg community to get involved in Wofford Athletics. The Assembly was told that next year the Athletic department will take on a full time intern to help Mr. Mathis with promotions and other activities. Mr. Mathis gave the Assembly an opportunity to share their concerns and ideas with him. After the Assembly expressed a desire for a tailgate area for students, Mr. Mathis said he would check on the availability of an area and possibly talk to Heather Morrow about space that is currently being used for student tailgating. The idea of using terrier bucks at concessions stands was discussed. Mr. Mathis said that this change is presently being worked on. After expressing that he understood that the music selections at athletic events do not always please the students, Mr. Mathis explained that music at outdoor events must be in the style of a classic rock radio station because the music can be heard for a distance extending beyond the boundaries of Wofford's campus. However, he would be willing to play some updated music for indoor athletic events like basketball and volleyball. The idea of moving the students' section, at home football games, was also addressed. Mr. Mathis said that this could be possible but there are some issues which include the reserved seats behind the football team. However, Mr. Mathis will check with the athletic department concerning this idea. The Assembly also suggested allowing the pep band or the visiting high school band(s) to sit closer to the student section. Mr. Mathis said he would consider this idea. Mr. Mathis thanked the Assembly for giving him suggestions and expressed his desire to work with them to increase school spirit and athletic attendance.

II. Call to Order:

President Fast called the meeting to order.

III. Invocation:

Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.

IV. Historian's Remark:

Ms. Smith gave the historian's remarks concerning past spring events at Wofford.

V. Roll Call:

Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VI. Approval of the Minutes

The minutes were approved as emailed by Secretary Glasgow.

VII. Officer Reports

a. Secretary:

Secretary Glasgow informed the Assembly that in addition to the agenda, proposals, and minutes (from the March 6 and March 13 meetings) normally given to them, this week she has also given them their delegate contracts and goals sheets back. Also, the delegates were given Assembly directories. Secretary Glasgow also reminded the Assembly that next week's meeting will be held at 7:30 due to the Faculty and Student Football Game.

VIII. Committee Reports

a. Executive:

Vice President Albergotti thanked Mr. Mathis for attending the meeting. She also explained that academic department will be invited to each Campus Union meeting. This week the government department was invited. Therefore, Vice President Albergotti welcomed Dr. Jeffrey from the government department. She yielded the floor to him. Dr. Jeffrey expressed how impressed his was with Campus Union and the way the Assembly conducts themselves. Vice President Albergotti explained that the ideas that were presented by the Academic Ad-Hoc Committee were discussed at the President's Committee meeting this past week. Also, there should be a report coming from Dean Wiseman concerning Interim. Lastly, Vice President Albergotti explained that the stress balls given to each delegate were from Mr. Mathis.

b. Elections & Nominations:

Vice President Albergotti congratulated the new chairs for the Campus Union standing committees, and also explained that each delegate has been assigned to a particular committee. In addition, the delegates were given a spread sheet which showed which delegates were assigned to which committees.

c. Financial Affairs Committee:

Treasurer Langley explained to the Assembly that there is \$4000 left in the general fund and should be used by the end of the semester.

d. Campus Relations Committee:

Ms. Hall explained that the student and faculty football game will be held next Monday night. The committee members will be selling tickets in Burwell on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Secretary Glasgow reminded the

assembly that the football game is mandatory and they should make sure to check in with her.

e. Wofford Activities Council:

Ms. Ruthsatz congratulated the new members of WAC. She explained that past committee's last meeting will be this coming Thursday. The new committee's first meeting will be next Thursday at 12pm in McMillan, and they will continue to plan and finalize Spring Weekend.

f. Facility Affairs:

Mr. Springs introduced himself to the Assembly as the new Facility Affairs Committee Chair. He congratulated the new members of the committee and thanked the Assembly for their facility requests/goals from the previous meeting.

g. Fun Funds:

Mr. Madigan told the Assembly about two Fun Funds events coming up. On March 23, there will be a crawfish and low country boil dinner in combination with a Corey Smith concert. In addition, there will be an event hosted by the Arts Living Learning Community on March 24. The event will include music, drums, and dinner.

IX. Old Business

No old business was discussed.

X. New Business

- a. Ms. Johnson made a motion to consider the Proposal to form an Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee. The motion was seconded and Ms. Johnson read the proposal; the floor was then opened for debate. Ms. Johnson explained the need for increased spirit and athletic attendance at Wofford. She also told the Assembly that there were eleven goals set by them, last week, that were related to athletics. Mr. Madigan asked who many people would be members of the committee. Ms. Johnson explained that President Fast would appoint the members, but the exact number had not been set. Secretary Glasgow reminded Mr. Madigan that he could offer a friendly amendment concerning the make up of the committee. Mr. Madigan said that he just thought that someone from each year should be on the committee. Ms. Johnson explained that she had thought about having a representative from each spectator sport, but she had not thought about having a representative from each class. Mr. Madigan then offered a friendly amendment be included in section five of the Whereas clause. Mr. Madigan suggested that section five read "The Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee will be appointed by the President of Campus Union and will consist of a mixture of Campus Union members, from each class, athletes, and fans." Ms. Johnson accepted the friendly amendment. The questions were called and the debate was ended. Ms. Johnson reread the entire

proposal due to the amendment change. The Assembly then voted, and the proposal was passed.

- b. Treasurer Langley made a motion to consider the Proposal to Form a Planning Activities Ad-Hoc Committee. The motion was seconded and Treasurer Langley read the proposal; the floor was then opened for debate. Treasurer Langley explained that this proposal was an idea taken from the cabinet's goals as a way to open the communication lines on campus. He said that he hoped a campus wide activities calendar would be a product of this committee. Mr. Madigan asked how each chartered organization will be made to attend the meetings. Mr. Langley explained that the organizations will be invited at first, at this time they cannot be required to attend. The questions were then called, and the debated was ended. Treasurer Langley reread the therefore clause, and the proposal was passed.

XI. Parliamentarians Report: Mr. Hinton

Mr. Hinton reminded the Assembly to address the President when they wanted to speak. Otherwise, he found the meeting to be in good order.

XII. Comments and Announcements

In addition to the comments and announcements on the agenda, other announcements were made. These included an announcement concerning Dr. McCain's talk that will be held Tuesday afternoon. Also, Dean Bigger commented on the cabinet's retreat. She stated that she believes the Assembly to be off to a good start, and she's just sorry she couldn't join the cabinet during their retreat, but they seemed to get a lot done. Mr. Madigan told the Assembly that following the Faculty and Student Football game, Fun Funds will sponsor a Faculty Band concert. President Fast commented that the Fun Funds event hosted by the Arts Living Learning Community, mentioned by Mr. Madigan, was actually scheduled for March 25 from 6pm-9pm.

XIII. Adjournment

Treasurer Langley moved to close the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

I. Call to Order

President Fast called the meeting to order.

II. Invocation

Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.

III. Historian's Remark

Ms. Smith gave the historian's remarks concerning the football history of Wofford due to the Student and Faculty Football Game.

IV. Approval of the Minutes

The minutes were approved as emailed by Secretary Glasgow.

V. Roll Call

Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VI. Officer Reports

a. Secretary

Secretary Glasgow announced Mr. Madigan as the Delegate of the Month for March. Mr. Madigan was very helpful during the Shuckin' and Shaggin' Fun Funds event and also presented a proposal to the Assembly.

VII. Committee Reports

a. Executive

Vice President Albergotti thanked the Assembly for coming to the Student and Faculty Football Game and told the Assembly that the cabinet looked forward to many proposals in the future.

b. Elections & Nominations

Vice President Albergotti had nothing to report.

c. Financial Affairs Committee

Treasurer Langley had nothing to report.

d. Campus Relations

Ms. Hall reported to the Assembly concerning the Student and Faculty Football Game. She said that the event raised \$1000 for the Bethlehem Center. She also told the

Ms. Ruthsatz reported that the first WAC meeting will be Thursday in McMillan Thursday at 12pm. She also announced that Spring Weekend will be April 20-22.

g. Fun Funds

Mr. Madigan announced that a band sponsored by Fun Funds was playing as the Assembly was meeting.

VIII. Board of Trustee Reports

a. Athletics

Mr. Roof discussed the Athletic Board meeting. He explained that there will be many improvements made to the Golf Learning Center, King Field, and Reeves Tennis Center. Mr. Roof also discussed the Terrier Club events. He explained that after raising over \$1.3 million in 2005, the Terrier Club's goal for 2006 is \$1.4 million. Mr. Roof also discussed the SoCon Basketball Tournament, Student Athlete Profiles, Sports Schedules, and Athletic Scholarship Funding.

b. Development

The minutes from the Development Meeting will be emailed by Dean Bigger.

c. Education

Ms. Wooten was unable to attend the meeting but sent a report by email to Secretary Glasgow, which was forwarded to the Assembly.

d. Enrollment

Vice President Albergotti gave the Enrollment Meeting report. She explained that during the meeting the early decision report was discussed. She also told the Assembly that the student body will increase over the next four years. Vice President Albergotti stated that two-thirds of the athletes at Wofford are male. She also told the Assembly that if they wanted more statistics related to the enrollment at Wofford, she would be glad to talk to them individually.

e. Evaluation-Planning-Marketing

Ms. Beachem stated that numerous issues were discussed in the meeting. She explained that Jenni Lister discussed blogs with the board members while Jenni Page discussed web updates that are to come. Ms. Beachem also explained that the FYI website for freshman students will be revamped.

f. Facilities

Mr. Sheridan was unable to attend the meeting, but Secretary Glasgow explained that the new housing project was discussed during the meeting.

g. Finance

Mr. Smith was unable to attend the meeting. Secretary Glasgow explained that the new housing project was the topic of discussion. Dean Bigger explained that Mike Brown began the project by giving a gracious \$1 million. She also told the Assembly that the tuition would increase next year. Mr. Madigan asked how much

the increase would be. Dean Bigger told the Assembly that the increase would be about \$2000. She said that students should see someone in financial aid if they needed additional scholarships. Treasurer Langley asked why an increase was put in place. Dean Bigger thanked Treasurer Langley for question stating that she had never been asked this question. She explained to the Assembly that in November each year the eight divisions of the President's cabinet meet to discuss the budget for the college. After requests for budget increases, the major priorities this year included salary increases, student activities, career services, athletics, and communications. Treasurer Langley asked if the college administration had considered increasing scholarships along with the tuition increase. Dean Bigger explained that it depends on the particular scholarship. She also explained that the different departments give out scholarships after a student's sophomore year. Ms. Ahmed asked if there was a way to this information to the students. Dean Bigger said that she would make sure that a copy of the President's letter, which was sent to parents explaining the tuition increase, would be placed in every student's mailbox before spring break.

h. Information Technology

Mr. Hinton was unable to attend the meeting.

i. Student Life

Ms. Mamele explained that the two amendments to the constitution and alcohol policy were discussed at the meeting. In addition, the Fun Funds Committee and its effectiveness was discussed. Dean Wallace also shared the helpfulness of the FYI program. Interim, WAC, black history month, women's history month, increase in student funding, and the Academic Ad-Hoc Committee were addressed. Mr. Langley asked if the Board liked the way Fun Funds was going. Ms. Mamele explained that the board members were confused, at first, about the difference in Fun Funds and WAC. However, after some explanation, they agreed that Fun Funds was great and thought that part of the addition Student Activities funding should be given to Fun Funds. Mr. Madigan asked when the additional funds would be budgeted. Ms. Mamele was not sure, but she thought it would be for the next academic school year. Dean Bigger explained that additional information will be coming. However, she had that a lump sum of money was given for Student Activities and at least \$25,000 will be used to fund the Fun Funds Committee. Ms. Mamele asked to whom the rest of the money will go to. Dean Bigger explained to the Assembly that the different student activities organizations and departments would have an opportunity to say what they would do with additional funding, and then a discussion will be made. Dean Bigger said she would probably have a final discussion of where the money was going to be budgeted by the final Campus Union meeting of the year.

XII. Comments and Announcements

In addition to the comments and announcements found on the agenda, Dean Bigger asked the Assembly to keep Paula Baker and Brian, in IT, in their thoughts and prayers. Mr. Madigan announced that there were over 180 high school seniors on campus for night and day. Mr. Baylis announced that Ms. Hall did a great job singing the National Anthem at the Student and Faculty Football Game. President Fast encouraged the Assembly members to email him if they were interested in being a part of the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee. He also expressed the need for strong people to be apart of the committee in order for the committee to be as successful as possible. Mr. Dekoster reminded the Assembly that the housing lottery will start tomorrow. Ms. Mamele expressed her concern that the facilities found in Richardson are not adequate for females. She also asked if the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee could look in to this problem. President Fast told Ms. Mamele that the Committee was not designed for such reasons but that he would have Mr. Springs and the Facilities Committee check on the concern. Mr. McGill asked how many people were going to be placed on the committee. President Fast said that a number had not been set but it would probably be about 8 to 12 students. Treasurer Langley stated that people who do not usually attend athletic events would be good candidates for the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee because they could help come up with ways to increase spirit. Dean Bigger wished the entire Assembly a good spring break.
