- I. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.
- III. Ms. Smith gave the historian's remarks regarding the fine arts at Wofford College. The fine arts were limited in the early years of the college; however, this changed in the 1960s and 1970s as fine arts began to flourish on campus.
- IV. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VI. Officer Reports
  - a. Secretary Glasgow had nothing to report.
- VII. Committee Reports
  - a. Vice President Albergotti gave the Executive report and encouraged the Assembly to attend the WAC Homecoming events this week.
  - b. The Elections & Nominations report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She reminded the Assembly to encourage the freshman to vote this Wednesday for their delegates. Dean Bigger asked who was running for the freshman delegate positions. Vice President Albergotti named the candidates. Mr. Hinton asked if the internet link would be mailed out to the freshman. Vice President Albergotti noted that Mr. Lawton would be out of town this week, so he sent the email early. She also added that the link would not work until Wednesday. Mr. Baylis asked if there was going to be a daily announcement about the elections. Vice President Albergotti noted that the vote today signs would be up as well as a daily announcement.
  - c. Treasurer Langley gave financial Affairs Committee report. He noted that there are no proposals this week and that about \$1150 has been approved through proposals thus far in the year. He also encouraged the Assembly to send people to him if they are in need of a proposal.
  - d. Campus Relations Committee report was given by Ms. Hall. She noted that the committee's next meeting would be Thursday at 11am. She stated that they are working on a publicity campaign to take place within the next month with the intent to promote Campus Union.

e. Mr. Springs gave the Facility Affairs Committee report. He noted that there are some difficulties with the bike project but the bikes should be available soon. He also noted that they are still working on improving the television channels available on campus. In addition, he mentioned that a printer will be available in the Commons within the next month or so; they are just waiting on a connection. Dean Bigger noted that the printer would be located at the receptionist's desk. Mr. Oates asked if students would be charged to print. Mr. Springs replied saying that the printer should work just like the ones in the library.

f. Wofford Activities Council report was given by Ms. Ruthsatz. She reminded the Assembly that Homecoming is this week. She noted that Spirit links are the service project for Homecoming and the money will go to aid Geno Thompson's brother who has leukemia. She mentioned that students would be able to vote for Mr. Wofford on Monday and Tuesday and Miss Homecoming on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. She added that t-shirts are being sold for \$10 and everyone should receive a Homecoming schedule in their CPOs. In addition, the skit competition and pep rally will be held on Wednesday in front of Old Main, while the Mr. Wofford competition will be held on Thursday in Leonard Auditorium. Ms. Ruthsatz reminded the Assembly that the Fuzz will be playing at the top of the Row and WAC participates would hand out cozies at 10pm on Friday. In addition, she added that the football game against the Citadel would begin at 1:30pm on Saturday. Lastly, she mentioned that they would meet on Thursday at noon in McMillan Theatre.

g. The Fun Funds report was given by Mr. Madigan. He mentioned that a tailgate was held Saturday and the committee will have a meeting tomorrow to discuss a few proposals. He mentioned that there are now guidelines set for the follow-up procedures surrounding Fun Fund events.

h. Ms. Johnson gave the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee report. She noted that everything went great during the previous weekend. She mentioned that the tailgate would be open this weekend for Homecoming. Vice President Albergotti asked when groups should reserve spots. Ms. Johnson noted that the spots are available on a first-come- first-serve basis. Mr. Baylis asked if the t-shirts that were given out at the game could be a part of the bookstore's selection. Ms. Johnson said they were not available for sale at this time, but she would discuss the idea at the meeting.

- I. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.
- III. Ms. Smith concerning the Wofford mascot, the terrier, gave the Historian's remarks.
- IV. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. The agenda was approved as presented.
- VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VII. Secretary Glasgow gave the secretary's report.
- VIII. Committee Reports
  - a. The Executive Committee report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She welcomed the new freshman delegates and thanked Ms. Gaylord and Ms. Ruthsatz for a great homecoming weekend.  
The Elections & Nominations report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She stated that the committee applications for freshman are due by 5pm on Wednesday. She also noted that the committee should look for an email, as there will be a meeting next Monday at 5pm in the conference room.
  - b. The Financial Affairs Committee report was given by Treasurer Langley. He explained that there is about \$2000 left in the budget to be allocated. He noted that proposals are probably slower because a great deal of funding was allocated for the fall during the spring.
  - c. The Campus Relations Committee report was given by Ms. Hall. She had nothing new to report.

e. The Wofford Activities Council report was given by Ms. Ruthsatz. She thanked Lauren Jackson and Susie Walker for their work with Homecoming. She mentioned that the College Town Idol contest would be held next week. Ms. Ruthsatz also explained that the committee is working on interim and spring events. Mr. Crowe added that the committee did a great job with Homecoming; it seemed to be a great success.

- I. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.
- III. Ms. Smith gave the historian's remarks concerning the organ in Leonard Auditorium and the annual fall concern.
- IV. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. The agenda was approved as presented.
- VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VII. Officer Reports
  - a. Secretary Glasgow gave her report mentioning the Halloween Carnival, which will be held on October 26. She will pass around a sign up sheet for time slots next week. She also asked for suggestions for the booth. Treasurer Langley suggested that President Fast should dress up for the occasion. Mr. Baylis suggested having an "ex-president" type booth. Mr. Crowe believes that Treasurer Langley should dress up as a dollar bill for the carnival. Mr. Wood suggested a face-painting booth.
- VIII. Committee Reports
  - a. The Executive report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She mentioned that everyone should have an abbreviated list of the delegate goals for this term in front of them. She noted that the goals were taken from the yellow goal sheets that were filled out by each delegate at the beginning of the term. The list contains the items that have not been completed. The goals are listed by delegate so that delegates can pair up to get things accomplished over the next few weeks. She also mentioned that the cabinet is ready to help with any and all of the goals.
  - b. The Elections & Nominations report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She noted that the committee had a meeting before the Assembly meeting tonight. She mentioned that freshman had been appointed to standing committees and the freshman delegates should be on the look out for an email from the committee chairs.
  - c. The Financial Affairs Committee report was given by Treasurer Langley. He noted that if the proposals are passed, \$1510 would be left in the proposal fund.

However, he pointed out that other funds are being used at this time that were allocated in the spring.

d. The Campus Relations Committee report was given by Ms. Hall. She mentioned that the committee is working on a publicity campaign, which includes handing out cups and pens during the last week in October. Vice President Albergotti asked if the committee is still working with Hubbub. Ms. Hall said that the committee would probably be doing something in conjunction with Hubbub in December.

e. The Facility Affairs report was given by Mr. Springs. He mentioned that things could not be delivered via Evan Street; instead, the road behind Papadopoulos should be used. Also, the speed limit on Evans Street is 20mph. He also added that the bike project is coming at some point. Vice President Albergotti mentioned that during the Board meetings today, the apartments were discussed and it is possible that 176 beds will be available in the village by next year. Ms. Hall asked if this number included the beds presently available. Vice President Albergotti said yes. Mr. Baylis asked if the area would continue to grow. Vice President Albergotti said that the Board will take a vote tomorrow and hopefully the village will continue to grow. Mr. Springs said that the plan, if voting goes well on Tuesday, is for the entire freshman class of this year to be able to live in the village during their senior year at Wofford. Mr. Madigan noted that we should all know more about the plan tomorrow after the Board's voting session. President Fast added that Board reports would be given and those should help clear up some confusion. Mr. McGill asked if there was in progress in getting a new food franchise in Zach's. Vice President Albergotti noted that the Cabinet spoke with Mr. Keasler and he mentioned that the college is looking to renovate Zach's over the summer and he would like to have the Assembly's input on those changes as well as what food venues students would like to see in the village. Mr. Crowe noted that there are quite a few Facilities Affairs related goals on the sheet that was handed out. He asked what the Assembly could do to get those implemented. Mr. Springs answered encouraging the Assembly to use the Facilities public folder to post ideas and concerns. He also mentioned that anyone could email him with ideas.

She also reminded the Assembly that Parents' Weekend begins on October 27, and WAC is sponsoring a band at the Row that night. She said that the interim and spring schedules would be discussed at the meeting on Thursday. Mr. Langley asked which band would be performing for Parents' Weekend. Ms. Gaylord answered saying that the Caribbean Cowboys, a shag/oldies band, will be performing.

g. The Fun Funds report was given by Mr. Madigan. He said that the presentation to the board went well and there is about \$61568 left in the budget. He mentioned that there will be a meeting tomorrow and there are a few events coming up.

h. Secretary Glasgow had nothing to report on behalf of the Planning Activities Committee.

i. The Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee report was given by Ms. Johnson. She mentioned that the committee is definitely pursuing the survey in Burwell to obtain suggestions to improve spirit. The committee is thinking of doing an organization point system to encourage attendance to games in the winter, especially basketball. She also mentioned that t-shirts will be on sale next week and they should be really cheap. Treasurer Langley asked if the college now has a fight song and what it sounds

like. Secretary Glasgow noted that there is a fight song and it's much different from a typical fight song. Mr. Dekoster asked if there were words to the fight song. Secretary Glasgow said that there are no words as of now. Ms. Johnson noted that hopefully the words would be coming soon. Mr. Crowe mentioned that the fight song was written by Dr. Dunlap's nephew and it's more classical in nature. Ms. Johnson encouraged the Assembly to give the song a chance, and she mentioned that she has it on her ipod if anyone would like to hear it.

X. New Business

- a. The Proposal for Funding for Outdoors Club Camping Trip in Tsali, NC was read by Ms. Barber. Mr. Baylis moved to open the floor for debate. He mentioned that the delegates would write proposals that are given to state representatives. Ms. Newman asked if the proposal is for \$972 or \$942 as the proposal seems a little misleading. Mr. Bryan said that the proposal is for \$972. Treasurer Langley added that the proposal is actually for \$942- the therefore clause is incorrect. Treasurer Langley also pointed out that the Financial Affairs Committee agrees that this is a great organization and should be funded, but it might be in the best interest to table this proposal until further information can be obtained. He made a motion to table and the proposal was tabled.
- c. Proposal for Funding Wofford College Debate was read by Mr. Madigan and the floor opened for debate. Mr. Madigan yielded the floor to Ms. Anjum. She stated that she is the treasure for the debate society. She mentioned that the organization is a great way for students to apply themselves and she would love the support of the Assembly. Mr. Baylis asked if there was significant interest in the organization. Ms. Anjum noted that there were four members last year, and about twelve this year. Treasurer Langley noted that the Assembly makes it a habit to not fund gas and he also mentioned that there are some other ways that the organization can obtain music and decorations. Therefore, he added that the Financial Affairs committee approved \$430 for this organization. He offered a friendly amendment to read "\$430" instead of "\$795." Mr. Madigan accepted the he amendment. Mr. Langley also pointed out that the organization has been trying to get a gavel for a while, and Mr. Thompson seemed to be against the idea. Ms. Hall asked if the event would be held on campus. Ms Anjum said that the event will be October 26 and it will be on campus. MR. Thompson noted that

he thought that the organization had already been given funding for a gavel, and he made it clear that the organization definitely has his support. The proposal was re-read, with the friendly amendment, and passed.

XI. The Parliamentarians Report was given by Mr. Hinton and he found the meeting to be in good order.

XII. Comments and Announcements

Mr. Crowe suggested that the debate society actively recruit on campus. Treasurer Langley mentioned that the board members are on campus and would like to talk to everyone. Mr. Bryan noted that he is looking to start a new organization to support the March of Dimes. He would love delegates to contact him if they would like to help. Mr. Wood added that the march would be an excellent chance to have Treasurer Langley dress as a dollar bill. President Fast said that it would be great if anyone has ideas for Mr. Bryan now, if not please let him know if you are interested. Mr. Hinton noted that he will be going to Wade's even though President Fast has dropped the ball on the tradition. President Fast mentioned that the women's soccer team beat Furman on Sunday. He also asked Mr. Wood about the new DVDs in the library. Mr. Wood said that he gave Mr. Jones a list. President Fast mentioned that the Assembly should use their resources wisely and think of movies they would like the library to purchase so that they do not have to rent or buy them. President Fast also welcomed the freshman and mentioned that the freshman who were absent last week will be sworn in soon. He also noted that many Assembly members received haircuts over the brake. Vice President Albergotti noted that Ms. Boshardt had her quickest time yet at the meet this weekend. Ms. Harris added that she was named the SoCo runner of the week. Mr. Dekoster mentioned that fall hospitality would be the Saturday on Parents' Weekend. He asked the Assembly to please help with the effort. - II. Mr. Crowe gave the invocation.
- III. Ms. Smith gave the historian remarks concerning the finances of Wofford College over the years.
- IV. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. The agenda was approved.
- VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VII. Officer Reports
  - a. Secretary Glasgow congratulated the assembly on having prefect attendance at the meeting. She also reminded the Assembly that Campus Union will have a booth at the Halloween Carnival and she encouraged each delegate to sign up for a time slot on the sign up sheet being passed around.
- VIII. Committee Reports
  - a. Vice President Albergotti gave the Executive report. She stated that the committee had a meeting before the Assembly meeting today. She added that the Cabinet met last week and discussed some new goals, many of which parallel the Assembly's goals. She also asked the freshman delegates to meet with the Cabinet for a few minutes after the meeting.
  - b. Vice President Albergotti had nothing to report on behalf of the Elections & Nominations Committee.
  - c. Treasurer Langley gave the Financial Affairs Committee report. He noted that there are two proposals this week. He added that there is about \$1510 still in the budget, and if the proposals this week are passed, there will be about \$1000 left. He mentioned that spring allocations would be mid to late November. In addition, Treasurer Langley added that the discount cards are in and will probably be placed in CPOs tomorrow.
  - d. Ms. Hall gave the Campus Relations Committee report. She discussed the Publicity campaign and mentioned that there will be a Campus Union article in the Old Gold and Black.
  - e. Mr. Springs gave the Facility Affairs Committee report. He mentioned that a Lightening walk should take place soon. Also, he added that there are currently only three study rooms in Olin, but by the end of the semester there should be about seven.
  - f. The Wofford Activities Council report was given by Ms. Ruthsatz. She mentioned that the Parents' weekend band is Friday not Saturday night at the Row. She asked the Assembly to spread the word. She also noted that everyone should get an email about voting for big concert in spring. The tentative date for the concert is May 3.

- g. Mr. Madigan gave the Fun Funds report. He noted that the Assembly should look for an event on Halloween- haunted trail sponsored by the arts living and learning community.
- h. Secretary Glasgow gave the Planning Activities Committee report. She mentioned that a meeting was held today and a calendar should be up in the next few weeks.
- i. Ms. Johnson gave the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee report. She mentioned that the upcoming weekend should be great. She noted that the Gold rush shirts would be sold at the women's soccer game for \$3. In addition, if students wear the shirts to the football game on Saturday, they will receive a free terrier towel.

#### IX. Board of Trustee Meeting Reports

- a. Ms. Johnson gave the Athletics report. She noted that NCAA leadership conference was discussed. She also added that there is a point system in the works to help encourage students to attend basketball games. Ms. Johnson added that Coach Ayers talked about football noting that the equipment is 12 years old. In addition, Coach Young added that the basketball team is very young- 10 freshman and sophomores. Ms. Johnson said that the W games were discussed and the Gold Rush t-shirts were shown. Also, the Terrier Club has raised about \$900,000 of their \$1.4 million goal. Ms. Johnson added that there are new faces among the athletic staff including a few interns. Also, the new village has turned out to be a great recruiting tool for athletics.
- b. Secretary Glasgow gave the Education report. She mentioned that the committee discussed that fact that Wofford is undergoing a re- accreditation process. In addition, Dean Maulsby shared information about new faculty members at the meeting. In addition, Secretary Glasgow added that the committee is aware of the proposal from the last assembly concerning the exam schedule. Mr. Baylis asked which departments are getting new faculty members. Secretary Glasgow answered that she cannot remember all of them, but the business, history, and biology departments should receive help within the next year. She stated that she could get Mr. Baylis specifics if he would like them.
- c. Mr. Madigan gave the Enrollment report. He noted that Wofford was aiming for about a 15% growth and received about an 18% growth this year. He added that Jenni Page is now working in admissions. Also, there is a goal of about 390 freshmen for the next school year, which would be able 3% more students than last year. He added that admissions is saving about \$30,000 by emailing financial aid packages instead of mailing them. Mr. Prosser asked how big the student body is supposed to get. Mr. Madigan noted that over about an 8-year period Wofford should be at about 1450.
- d. Ms. Smith was unable to attend the Evaluating-Planning-Marketing meeting.
- e. Mr. Springs attended the Facilities meeting. He mentioned that the committee discussed the streetscape on Evans and Cummings streets and Leonard Auditorium and Old Main renovations. He also added that progress reports were given on all buildings on campus. He noted that all are fine except for black science annex. Mr. Springs was asked his opinion of the new village and discussed the idea with the committee. Mr. Crowe asked what the plans are for Black Science Annex. Mr. Springs responded saying that they are not positive right now. Treasurer Langley asked when the trees would be planted on Evans and Cummings Streets. Mr. Springs mentioned that there are studies being done on trees that would look best in the area. He added that a tree out of Japan is probably going to be the chose. President Fast added that fall is tree-planting season. Ms. Ahmed asked if there are plans to add parking along with the apartments. Mr. Springs answered saying that he did not hear anything about additional parking but that there is now a new parking lot behind the apartments.
- f. Treasurer Langley gave the Finance meeting report. He noted that the Endowment was discussed and it seems that Wofford has out performed other schools. He mentioned that an accounting update was given and everything seems to be going well. The Committee

approved a \$12 million loan for the new apartments. The Board members mentioned that they do not want to use the hotel to house students because of the liability issues. Treasurer Langley added that the Village should put Wofford at less than 100% occupancy, which is great. Mr. Baylis asked if tuition is going to increase. Mr. Langley noted that the budget is set in February but he has been told that tuition will increase by a certain percentage each year, so it will go up next year.

- g. Ms. Carr was unable to attend the Information Technology meeting.
- h. Vice President Albergotti gave the Student Life report. She mentioned that Ms. Morrow discussed Greek life changes for recruitment and rush next year. Also, Public safety is concentrating on alcohol awareness and education. She added that freshman maybe in Carlisle possibly next year because beds will be about 99% full. The committee supported the apartments especially so students do not have to live off campus, and she added that the apartments did pass through the Board as a whole. She mentioned that President Fast gave an excellent report, and the Board seemed to be impressed with Campus Union at this point. Mr. Baylis asked what percentage of students are involved in Greek Life now. Vice President Albergotti said that she was not sure. Mr. Madigan added that he believes the percentage to be about 54%. Dean Bigger noted that the student body is now at less than 50% Greek. She added that she would send statistics to the Assembly concerning the current student make up. Mr. Madigan asked is specific dates have been set for Recruitment and Rush next year. Vice President Albergotti said no. Ms. Harris asked where the college would put the freshman, as the class grows larger. Mr. Madigan stated that the first floor of Carlisle would be used. Dean Bigger added that there were 378 freshmen this year and there should be 390 next year.

#### X. Old Business

The Proposal for Funding South Carolina Student Legislature was brought back to the table Mr. Bryan read the proposal; the floor was opened for debate. Mr. Bryan yielded the floor to Treasurer Langley. Treasurer Langley noted that the Financial Affairs Committee looked at this proposal again and because Campus Union usually funds \$50/per/room for a hotel and the fact that this group must stay at this hotel, which is more expensive, the committee so decided that they would fund one room for six people. Treasurer Langley added that Doyle Boggs might be able to fund some too. He then offered a friendly amendment to change the therefore clause to read \$356 for 12 students. Mr. Bryan accepted the amendment. Vice President Albergotti then offered another friendly amendment to change the 12 students to six students. Mr. Bryan accepted. The debate was ended; the proposal re-read with the friendly amendments and was passed by the Assembly.

#### XI. New Business

- a. Ms. Smith moved to consider the Proposal for Funding of Wofford Fellowship of Christian Athletes. The motion was seconded, the proposal read and the floor opened for debate. Ms. Smith stated that FCA wants to bring the athletes to the campus and get the organizations name out there. Vice President Albergotti asked how many people in addition to the teams would be present. Ms. Smith noted that the organization usually had about 30-50 people coming to meetings in general. Treasure Langley added that the financial affairs committee approved \$225 for this proposal, and thus he offered a friendly amendment to change the therefore clause to read \$225. Ms. Smith accepted the amendment. The debate was ended; the proposal was re-read and passed.

XII. Mr. Hinton gave the Parliamentarians Report and found the meeting to be in good order.

XIII. Comments and Announcements

Mr. Crowe noted that fall hospitality would be held this Saturday. Mr. Madigan reminded the Assembly of the event at Liberty Trial. President Fast mentioned that the Ultimate Frisbee team received 3<sup>rd</sup> place at the tournament this week. Treasure Langley noted that IFC would be passing hats at the game. He added that Mr. Crowe has more details. Mr. Crowe mentioned that funds would be collect to support the Rally Foundation, which is under funded by \$30million for cancer research for kids. He encouraged the Assembly to support the cause and stop by the kids' zone before the game to get more details. He added that Wofford would be the first college to pull off a fundraiser for the Rally Foundation. In addition, he added that the passing of hats would also take place at Greek organizations' meetings this week and if another organization would like to participate please let him know. Fast- wade's after meeting

Ms. Harris mentioned that there would be a cross-country meet this Saturday for conference race. Mr. Baylis added that some delegates would be going to Sake after the meeting instead of Wade's.

XIV. The meeting was adjourned.

- 1) A college education is not complete if its graduates are unequipped with necessary life skills including, but not limited to, such things as how to buy a car, buy a house, take out a loan, buy insurance, invest, and plan for the future.
- 2) Numerous seniors have expressed interest in such a course that would appeal to students of all majors and require little to no prior knowledge on the subject or any particular major experience.
- 3) The course could be taught in a single afternoon for minimal academic credit, Professors in the Finance and Economics Departments have expressed a willingness to participate in offering a course of this nature, and experts in given fields from the Spartanburg community could be found to teach certain topics.

**Therefore be it resolved by the Campus Union Assembly that:**

We recommend the development and approval of a financial “nuts and bolts” course for the Spring 2007 semester to the appropriate college officials.
