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Campus Union Assembly Minutes
September 11, 2006
6:00 PM, Olin Theater

- I. Mr. Lemere addressed the Assembly concerning the statistics of the incoming freshman class. He stated that admissions received 2089 applications; 378 students were admitted and 19 transfers accepted. The class make up is as follows: 51% women, 49% men, 13% are of color, 56% in-state, and 61% of the class was rated in the top 10% of their graduating classes. Mr. Lemere also updated the Assembly on the progress of the new housing. He noted that the first phase should be finished on Friday and the second phase should be completed on October 15. Mr. Lemere asked if there were any questions. Ms. Albergotti asked about the length of time that the on-campus dryers are set for. Mr. Lemere explained that the dryers should be set for 60 minutes, not for 14 minutes, and the problem should be fixed now. Mr. Lemere thanked the Assembly for all that they have been doing and wished Mr. Hinton a happy birthday.
- II. President Fast called the meeting to order.
- III. Mr. Crowe gave the Invocation.
- IV. Ms. Smith gave the Historian's Remarks concerning the history of how Ms. Rita came to be part of the Wofford family.
- V. The minutes were approved by the Assembly.
- VI. The agenda was approved as presented.
- VII. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VIII. Officer Reports
 - a. Secretary Glasgow noted that the candy was from the Cabinet as a welcome back treat. She also mentioned that there will be a Campus Union table at the Interest Fair on Wednesday and everyone is encouraged to stop by to encourage freshman to run for a delegate position.
- IX. Committee Reports
 - a. The Executive report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She welcomed the Assembly back and noted that the Executive Committee is excited about the coming semester. She stated that the committee met last Monday. In addition, she mentioned

some of the accomplishments of the Assembly thus far. These included: meal trade out plan in Zach's; sound system in Raines; and additional ice machine on-campus. She noted that a letter in the mail from President Fast, with a list of the Assembly's accomplishments, should be going out soon. She noted that the Cabinet would like help stuffing the CPOs with President Fast's letter. She thanked the Assembly for supporting the athletic ad-hoc committee and encouraged the Assembly to give feedback concerning the prizes given away at the game.

b. Vice President Albergotti gave Elections & Nominations report. She mentioned that the elections for freshman will be the first week in October.

c. Financial Affairs Committee's report was presented by Treasurer Langley. He noted that with the money left in the budget from the preceding, the Assembly was able to purchase an ice machine and stereo system for Raines. He stated that the remaining funds were rolled into the general fund and hopefully used to purchase new beds for green. In addition, he mentioned that the Assembly also helped get an ATM in the Commons. Treasurer Langley discussed the student discount cards. He noted that they should be ready in the next few weeks. Also, he informed the Assembly that there is \$3200 in general proposals. He also reminded the delegates that proposals should be in by the Friday before the meeting. He also noted that the next Financial Affairs Committee meeting would be this week so that the committee can discuss discount cards and proposals.

d. Ms. Hall reported for the Campus Relations Committee; she stated that the first meeting would be this Thursday in the Commons.

e. The Facility Affairs Committee report was presented by Mr. Springs. He mentioned that he is looking forward to a good year. He noted that the committee is looking to have a facilities forum soon similar to Greek Life forum; he also mentioned that the forum would be televised. Mr. Springs commented on the new apartments, noting that the committee is working on a special meal plan for the students living in the apartments. Also, Mr. Springs mentioned that the committee is looking into the television channels offered on campus. In addition, he noted that the bike project is soon to be finished.

f. Ms. Ruthsatz presented the report for the Wofford Activities Council. She mentioned that the discount tickets for USC game are sold out, but athletics still has tickets; however, they are the normal price. Also, Homecoming is in the works. The next WAC event will be a bowling party on the east side of town on September 20 from 8-10pm.

g. The Fun Funds Committee report was presented by Mr. Madigan. He mentioned the first two events of the year one given by orientation and the other by the Campus Union Cabinet. He mentioned that the next event is hosted by IFC at the top of row and is a sober event from 5-8pm on Friday.

h. The Planning Activities Committee report was presented by Secretary Glasgow. She noted that the student activities calendar should be up this week. She encouraged the Assembly to mention the committee to other organizations they are involved in.

X. There was no Old Business to discuss.

XI. New Business

- a. Ms. Carr moved to consider the Proposal for Funding an On-Campus Aerobics Classes; the motion was seconded and read. The floor was opened for debate. Ms. Carr noted that the classes were held last year and seemed to be a huge success. Ms. Smith asked which days the classes would be held. Ms. Carr noted that those specifics have not been determined but will probably be on Mondays and Wednesdays from 8-9pm. Ms. Johnson asked if the same instructor would be used this year. Ms. Carr answered saying that the instructor would be the same for the classes. Mr. Baylis made a friendly amendment to change “totally” to “totaling” in the “therefore” clause. The friendly amendment was accepted by Ms. Carr. Treasurer Langley mentioned that the Financial Affairs Committee approved the proposal. He also noted that he made the mistake on the proposal, not Ms. Carr. The debate was ended by Mr. Madigan. The proposal was re-read and passed with the friendly amendment.

XII. Parliamentarians Report: Mr. Hinton reported that he found the meeting to be in very good order; in addition, he thanked the Assembly for their birthday wishes.

XIII. Comments and Announcements

President Fast noted that it was Mr. Hinton’s birthday. He also stated that the Remembrance of September 11, 2001 would be held tonight in Gibbs Stadium at 7pm. President Fast mentioned that Opening Convocation will be held at 11am tomorrow in Leonard Auditorium. He also announced that Ms. Johnson has been named delegate of the month by the Cabinet for her extremely work with the Athletic Ad-Hoc Committee. President Fast also informed the Assembly that Mr. Wood wants more movies in the library. He noted that Dean Coburn says it is possible to purchase additional movies. President Fast encouraged other Assembly members to see Mr. Wood if they have ideas. Mr. Hinton announced that September 18 is Constitution Day and noted that if anyone would like to help with activities to see him. Mr. Madigan mentioned the IFC fun funds event that is planned for Friday at Row from 5-8pm. Dean Bigger welcomed the Assembly back to campus. She congratulated Ms. Johnson on her amazing job with promoting Athletics. Dean Bigger also mentioned that the Campus Union officers worked hard over the summer. She stated that they held cabinet meetings in the summer. She believes that it is important for the Assembly to know what is being done behind the scene by the Cabinet. She stated that the works of Campus Union look easy because the Cabinet is doing their part. Dean Bigger enjoys working with the Cabinet; she mentioned that this is the first time in her 11 years at Wofford that the cabinet has visited the campus during the summer to plan the upcoming year. Furthermore, Dean Bigger announced that the Student Affairs offices have been moved and shuffled in the Raines Center. She explained that the Assembly should expect many new things from student affairs. She expects a great year. In addition, she mentioned that Student Affairs now has the most money ever for social events. She also announced that the speaker on Wednesday is open to all campus members. She also promoted the CollegeTown event on Thursday night noting that the band concert is free downtown on Morgan Square. She mentioned that she is chairing the committee for the event and want to see more Wofford students than any other school. Treasurer Langley mentioned that the administration of the college is more than willing to meet with students. He noted that they have asked to meet with and have met with the cabinet so please let them know your opinions so they can help

achieve the desires of the students. President Fast asked if there was anything, someone did not understand that was taking place on campus. He mentioned that the ATM for the Commons is here; it is just not exactly ready for use yet. Mr. Baylis asked if the ATM was affiliated with a specific bank. President Fast noted that he did not believe that the ATM was affiliated.

- I. Dean Goss spoke to the Assembly concerning Career Services. He noted that Career Services is a four person staff. He also explained that there are many things that students do not know about resumes, interviews, and other things that exist after their time at Wofford. Dean Goss mentioned that most people do not really know what they want to do after college. He stated that the Career Service staff is available to help students in numerous areas. The different tests and programs that are used were explained to the Assembly. Dean Goss noted that "it's never too late and it's never too early to get started." He also mentioned that the department is working on a few events, which can be found on the Campus Calendar, to aid the student body in the future. Dean Goss asked if there were any questions. Mr. Springs asked about an interview workshop Dean Goss answered saying that the workshop will be on Wednesday, but he mentioned that if someone cannot make the workshops to let his office know and they will be glad to work with anyone at anytime. Mr. Baylis asked who was coming to the law school day. Dean Goss noted that there are numerous schools attending including the University of South Carolina and Wake Forest. Mr. Crowe asked how long it takes to through the process of testing and determining what one wants to do after Wofford. Dean Goss responding saying that it depends on the student. However, he did mention that it does not usually take too long. Online testing programs are often used along with two other meetings, which are short. And, from that point on, the rest is mostly up to the student. Mr. Baylis asked what exactly interview day was. Dean Goss explained that there are two interview days, one is for all South Carolina independent colleges and universities day. The event is held in Columbia and real interviews are conducted. The other interview day is just for Wofford and Converse and includes the same process it's just smaller. Both days consist of actual interviews where students are evaluated and hopefully offered jobs. Dean Goss ended encouraging everyone to make an appointment with his office. He noted that he hopes to see each Campus Union member very soon.

VII. Secretary Glasgow called roll.

VIII. Officer Reports

Secretary Glasgow mentioned that she had placed attendance reports for each Campus Union member on top of their agendas. She reminded the Assembly of the attendance policy and asked them to let her know if they thought the report, they had been given was incorrect. Secretary Glasgow moved for unanimous consent to move the September 25 meeting to 5:30 pm. With no objection, the motion was accepted. She then moved for unanimous consent to make it mandatory for the Assembly to participate in the road clean up of Church Street on October 2 at 5:30 pm. Again, the motion was accepted without objection. Lastly, Secretary Glasgow moved to hold a special election on Thursday September 21 to fill the open Junior and Senior delegate positions. This motion was also accepted without opposition.

IX. Committee Reports

a. The Executive Committee report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She welcomed the visitors and mentioned that the Cabinet would be glad to answer any questions they had after the meeting. She also explained that similar to the Water Day that was held last semester, by the Assembly, the Cabinet would like to hold a Water/Lemonade giveaway on Friday. She passed around a sign up sheet for people to sign up to work the tables outside on Olin, Milliken, and Old Main from about 9am to 9:45am. Also, she noted that there would be an executive meeting next Monday.

b. Vice President Albergotti gave the Elections & Nominations Committee report. She mentioned the special election to fill the Junior and Senior Delegate positions. She also noted that the Freshman elections would be held on October 4.

c. Financial Affairs Committee report was given by Treasurer Langley. He noted that there is \$2650 left in the general proposal fund. He mentioned that delegates can refer people to him or as a delegate, they can sponsor any proposal. Also, he stated that flyers would go up soon to publicize to the general student body the process of getting money through Campus Union. He also mentioned that the discount cards should be ready in a week or so and should contain about the same number of discount opportunities as last year.

d. Ms. Hall gave the Campus Relations Committee report. She mentioned that there would be a Tuesday meeting @ 11am in the Commons. She also noted that the committee would hopefully be working with hubbub over the next couple of weeks and months.

e. Facility Affairs Committee Report was given by Mr. Springs. He noted that he had nothing to report at the time. However, Mr. Hinton asked when the apartments would be ready. He stated that they should be ready for students to move in on Thursday at 2pm. Mr. Langley mentioned that a sophomore approached him concerning the cable channels available in Richardson. Mr. Springs said he would check on getting more channels.

f. Wofford Activities Council report was given by Ms. Gaylord. She mentioned that there will be a WAC Bowling night at Star Lanes on Wednesday night from 8pm-

10pm. She also noted that there will be no transportation, but pizza will be available. The next WAC meeting will be Thursday.

g. Fun Funds Committee report was given by Mr. Madigan. He thanked everyone for coming out Friday for the event at the Row. He mentioned that a packet is being put together to clear up some confusion concerning the Fun Funds process. He noted that he received four proposals today and encouraged everyone to keep them coming.

h. Planning Activities Committee report was given by Secretary Glasgow. However, she had nothing to report at this time.

X. Board of Trustee Meeting Reports

- a. The Athletics Board report was given by Ms. Johnson. She noted that they discussed that the majority of the diversity at Wofford comes from athletics. She also stated that they discussed other schools that are now competition for Wofford. Also, the Board discussed the athletic budget.
- b. Development: Mr. Brown was not present and thus the Development report was not given.
- c. Secretary Glasgow gave the Education report. She mentioned that diversity was of great concern. And, also, she explained that Wofford is being evaluated for accreditation. She also mentioned that standardized testing would be used to evaluate the level of education being received at Wofford.
- d. Enrollment report was given by Mr. Madigan. He noted that it was a good meeting. He mentioned that 378 students were admitted as Wofford is looking to grow. He stated that the goal is to be at 1450 students in eight years.
- e. The Evaluating-Planning-Marketing report was given by Ms. Smith. She mentioned that podcasts were discussed, along with the web site and the updated mailing list for the Wofford magazine.
- f. Mr. Springs was unable to attend the Facilities meeting. However, President Fast mentioned that he attended the meeting for a few minutes and the apartments were of the most concern.
- g. The Finance report was given by Treasurer Langley. He noted that he sat beside Mr. Milliken who really liked his Wofford tie. He mentioned that he was a little lost in the meeting. However, it appeared that Wofford has been doing well financial over last few years. He said the funding for the new apartments was of the most concern in the meeting. He said that they also discussed what to do with the extra revenue coming from the additional students on campus.
- h. Ms. Carr did not attend the Information Technology meeting. However, Mr. Crowe did. He mentioned that the idea of allowing people to keep their Wofford email addresses after graduation was considered. The Board members also discussed how wireless they really wanted to campus to become as updates are soon to be needed.
- i. Vice President Albergotti gave the report for the Student Life meeting. She mentioned that the meeting consisted of the changes in career services, the student affairs report, Mr. Madigan's fun funds report, and the considering of Constitutional amendments. Dean Bigger added that President Fast came to the meeting in order to bring the fire alarms to the attention of the board. He was then sent to the Financial Affairs meeting. A visitor asked about the Constitution changes. He wondered if a blast email could be sent to the students. Vice

President Albergotti mentioned that an email was sent out and the amendments were not approved by the student body. Mr. Crowe asked Secretary Glasgow what the Education Board was trying to do concerning the diversity issue on campus. Secretary Glasgow mentioned that the Board did not seem extremely concerned; the idea is to have quality students instead of a set percentage of a certain ethnic group.

XI. There was no Old Business to be discussed.

XII. There was no New Business to be discussed.

XIII. Parliamentarians Report was given by Mr. Hinton and he found the meeting to be in good order.

XIV. Comments and Announcements

President Fast declared that Ms. Cromer has transferred to USC Beaufort and Mr. Brown has stepped down as a Senior delegate due to his Young Life commitment. He mentioned that an Aerobics class would be held at 8pm tonight. He also stated that he attended the South Eastern Student Government Conference in Charleston this weekend. He complimented the Assembly because in comparison to other schools, they are doing well. He said that he would be glad to answer questions. Mr. Crowe explained that he would like for the students to get involved with some sort of bet for big athletic games. A visitor mentioned that in high school his school competed and raised money for an outside organization. President Fast noted that Wofford and Furman compete in a can food drive, but Furman always wins. Dean Bigger mentioned that a football was once run to Furman by Wofford students after a game. President Fast noted that he would love to go to Wade's with a group of Campus Union people tonight after the meeting. Dean Bigger noted that President Fast represented the Assembly well. She also stated that she is proud of the student government and judicial system at Wofford. She also asked the Assembly to keep Mr. Johnson's wife, who had a heart attack, in their prayers. Dean Bigger also stated that the Assembly should sing happy birthday to the WAC co- chair, Ms. Ruthsatz. The Assembly stood and sang to Ms. Ruthsatz. Mr. Hinton mentioned that Dr. Jeffery will be giving a speech tomorrow at 11:30 am and he encouraged everyone to attend. MR. Crowe asked the Assembly to keep the McCraw family in their prayers. Ms. Smith asked when the recital was that was mentioned on the agenda. Secretary Glasgow apologized, but she could not remember but noted that the event was on the Campus Calendar.

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- VI. Secretary Glasgow called roll.
- VII. Officer Reports

Secretary Glasgow had nothing to report. However, during her report the Assembly voted on their nominations for Miss Homecoming and Mr. Wofford. President Fast will represent the Assembly as their Mr. Wofford nominee, while Vice President Albergotti will be the Assembly's Miss Homecoming nominee.
- VIII. Committee Reports
 - a. Vice President Albergotti had nothing to report on behalf of the Executive Committee. Dean Bigger asked what the Wednesday deadline was for freshman petitions. Vice President Albergotti answered saying that the petitions are due at noon to student affairs.
 - b. The Elections & Nominations report was given by Vice President Albergotti. She noted that freshman election will be held October 4 and petitions for those elections are due September 27. Also, she mentioned that the committee would meet tomorrow at 4pm to vote on college committee appointments.
 - c. The Financial Affairs Committee report was given by President Fast. He mentioned that both of the proposals were approved at the meeting.
 - d. Ms. Hall gave the Campus Relations Committee report. She noted that the committee is going to begin working with hubbub over the next few weeks and months.

e. Facility Affairs Committee report was given by Mr. Springs. He noted that the Bike project should be under way soon as the bikes will be on campus in the next few days. He then explained the details of using the bikes. He also mentioned that he is working with Dr. Wood to hopefully improve the television channel options on campus. A visitor asked how many bike racks are actually on campus. Mr. Springs answered saying that there are about fourteen racks spread around campus. The visitor asked if an email could be sent to students to let them know where the racks are located. Vice President Albergotti mentioned that an email would be sent out as soon as the bikes are on campus and ready for use.

f. Vice President Albergotti gave the Wofford Activities Council report. She mentioned that the organization packets for Homecoming are due to Student Affairs by noon. A visitor asked what the ten dollars, that the nominees for Miss Homecoming are required to pay, is going to. Dean Bigger explained that WAC must raise additional funds throughout the year, as their budget is not large enough to cover the expenses that accumulate throughout the year. Dean Bigger answered with no to this question.
