IV. SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

G. Firearms

Firearms may not be kept in residence halls or spaces leased to Greek letter organizations. Students should acquaint themselves with all laws governing possession and use of firearms. Firearms may be stored in the Campus Safety Office and are subject to all laws. (Refer to pages 104-105 for complete policy.)

Proposal to Amend the Wofford College Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities

Nathan Madigan and Leland Wood

WHEREAS:

1. Campus and personal safety is the highest priority of students, faculty and staff
2. Firearms and weapons of any kind are not allowed on campus
3. The Code and the College policies are enforced by the Judicial System and the staff of the college
4. The definition of firearms and weapons needs to be clearly defined as it is in the policy section of the Student Handbook
5. The Code is a reference for student and administrative judicial officer

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Campus Union Assembly that Article IV Section G of the Wofford College Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities be amended to read as follows:

IV. SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

G. Firearms and Weapons

The possession and/or use of firearms, weapons, and other propelling devices, as well as explosives such as fireworks, ammunition, or chemicals, which are explosive in nature, as prohibited on campus. Unauthorized use, possession, or storage of any weapon (other than storage in the Campus Safety Office) on campus constitutes a violation of the code and college policy. All weapons (including hunting and recreational weapons) must be checked in and secured by the director of campus safety. All weapons are strictly prohibited in students' rooms and elsewhere on campus.

Weapon is defined as any object or substance designed to cause reasonable apprehension of physical harm to any person, inflict a wound, cause injury, incapacitate, or damage personal property, and includes, but is not limited to, all firearms, guns, Airsoft guns, BB guns, potato guns, paint guns, pellet guns, stun guns, axes, saws, slingshots, nunchakus, knives (with blades three inches or more in length and all switchblades), box cutters, and bows and arrows.

Note: the College reserves the right to confiscate anything it deems hazardous or dangerous.

VIII. The Judicial System

A. Judicial Commission

2. Composition

- a. There shall be nine members; five of which are elected as follows: two at large from the student body and one member each from the rising senior, junior, and sophomore classes; four of which are appointed by the Electoral Board during the

month of February following an application and interview as follows: one at large from the student body and one member from each of the rising senior, junior and sophomore classes.

C. Administrative Court

2. Composition

- a. Nine members of the Wofford College administrative staff will be appointed by the president of Wofford College in concurrence with the annual election of the members of the Judicial Commission.
- b. Members will serve a term of one year, with vacancies to be filled immediately by presidential appointment.
- c. At least three of the nine members *and one student commissioner* must be present to conduct court.

Proposal to Amend the Wofford College Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities Nathan Madigan and Leland Wood

Whereas,

1. The Campus Union amended the Judicial System in February 2004
2. A student member of the Judicial Commission was added as a member of the Administrative Court
3. Students will benefit from a more efficient and effective Judicial System by these revisions to the *Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities*
4. The proposed revisions to the *Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities* will provide for a heightened level of student empowerment and support the Campus Union's commitment "to the preservation of the ideals of the college and to the improvement of campus life" as well as the resolve "to promote the orderly and efficient administration of student activities."

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Campus Union Assembly that Article VIII Section A. 2. and Section C. 2. of the Wofford College Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities be amended to read as follows:

A. Judicial Commission

1. Purposes and Duties

- g. To read statements of intent to appeal and to determine whether grounds are sufficient to warrant an appeal to the Appeals Court ***and to notify students via e-mail or campus mail of their decisions within 48 of the next weekly Judicial Commission's meeting not counting student holidays or weekends.***

2. Composition

- a. There shall be ***eleven*** members; six of which are elected as follows: ***three*** at large from the student body and one member each from the rising senior, junior, and sophomore classes; ***five*** of which are appointed by the Electoral Board during the month of February following an application and interview as follows: ***two*** at large from the student body and one member from each of the rising senior, junior and sophomore classes.

C. Administrative Court

2. Composition

- a. ***Eleven*** members of the Wofford College administrative staff will be appointed by the president of Wofford College in concurrence with the annual election of the members of the Judicial Commission.

- b. Members will serve a term of one year, with vacancies to be filled immediately by presidential appointment.
- c. *Administrative hearings will be conducted with either two of the eleven administrative members and one student commissioner or three administrative members and two of the student commissioners.*

D. Appeals Court

3. Appeals Process

- c. Any member of the campus community has the right to appeal a sanction. Only the accused person has the right to appeal a guilty verdict. *The Judicial Commission then must notify the student of their decision to accept or deny their appeal within 48 hours of the next weekly Judicial Commission's meeting via e-mail or campus mail excluding student holidays and or weekends.*

Proposal for funding for Wofford REC (Robotics and Engineering Cadre)

WHEREAS:

1. Wofford REC is a chartered organization and deserves funding from Campus Union.
2. Wofford REC has not yet received funding from Campus Union
3. Wofford REC is in need of funding to get their project off the ground and to further their organization.
4. Wofford REC is a unique opportunity for student involvement in the process of constructing autonomous robots, including program, circuitry, and structure design, and is a unique application of mathematics, engineering, computer science, and physical science to develop hands-on extracurricular activities for students and faculty and to structure an effective team for accredited competitions.
5. Wofford REC is in need of funding for LEGO Mindstorms Kit(s) to construct an autonomous robot(s), expansion kits, and tools for wire and hardware modification, including soldering equipment and computer-grade screwdrivers and pliers.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT \$1020.00 be given to Wofford REC to help meet expenses.

The breakdown of the budget is as such:

- **\$600.00** LEGO Mindstorms NXT Kit (2 @ \$300)
- **\$92.00** Additional LEGO Mindstorms parts, including \$50.00 for rechargeable battery and \$42.00 for various cables, etc.
- **\$20.00** Computer Tool Kit 11 Piece + additional tools
- **\$50.00** Standard Quality and non-faulty Soldering Kit
- **\$33.00** Maximum Lego NXT: Building Robots with Java Brains by Brian Bagnall (Book)
- **\$25.00** LEGO Mindstorms NXT Hacker's Guide by Dave Prochnow
- **\$200.00** Additional parts, including various sensors, such as infrared, etc.

Proposal to recommend door locks be placed on the outside bathroom doors in Lesene Residence Hall.

Whereas,

1. Currently there are no locks on the outside bathroom doors in Lesene Dorm,
2. There have been increased safety concerns throughout the building,
3. Students feel that even if they keep their doors locked, others can still come in through their suite mates rooms,
4. Several items from different rooms have been stolen,
5. It would help students in that Dorm to feel much safer,
6. All other suite style dorms have locks on the bathroom doors,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that Wofford College Campus Union recommend that outside bathroom locks be placed in all rooms in Lesene Dorm.

Resolution for the 2007- 2008 Campus Union Assembly of Wofford College to Recommend a Computer and Printer be Allocated to Biology Department (Majors).

WHEREAS:

1. Biology majors currently are unable to access specific PDA files off of the current Milliken computers,
2. The Chemistry department computers are only available to Chemistry majors,
3. The previous computer available to Biology majors has been removed, and the other computer is limited to professor use,
4. Being able to print and access work in the same building as class would allow students to be better prepared,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Wofford College 2007-2008 Campus Union Assembly recommend that a computer and printer be allocated to the Biology Department and their majors.

Proposal to Give the 2007 Senior Class the Funds Remaining in the 2006-2007 Campus Union Proposals Budget

Whereas,

1. Each year, the Senior Class, led by their Senior Class officers, coordinate and raise money to have two graduation parties for themselves and their family and friends during graduation weekend.
2. This year's Senior Class has already successfully raised money through fundraisers, completed two on-campus projects, and began to endow their class scholarship and has received Fun Fund money for its Saturday night party.
3. The Senior Class would greatly benefit from Campus Union general proposals funds for its Friday night party that is open to all members of the Wofford Community, free of charge.
4. The Senior Class has, by precedent, received the Campus Union proposals budget's remaining funds at the end of each year to help cover the costs of its graduation weekend events, as this is of great benefit to the Senior Class and as Campus Union does not roll over funds to the next year.

Therefore, be it resolved that:

 1. Mr. Patel added a friendly amended to give \$250 which was accepted by Mr. Andrew.
 2. The Proposal [assed unanimously with the THEREFORE clause having been amended.
- d. Ms. Bishop spoke on behalf of his Proposal for Allocating Remaining Campus Union Funds.
