- I. President Albergotti called the meeting to order.
- II. Mr. Hray gave the invocation.
- III. Ms. Wooten gave the Historian's Remark regarding the United Kingdom and treaty of Paris which recognized the United States as a sovereign nation. She also explained that in September of 1958, Dr. Charles F. Marsh became president of Wofford College.

- V. Secretary Abee called the roll.

Whereas:

1. WoCo Wake Riders is a chartered organization on campus.
2. Wofford's team competes in the South Atlantic Conference.
3. The tournament provides a chance for members of the team to further their knowledge and ability in water sports and to meet people from other schools who have similar interests.
4. In Wofford's first year of competition, they qualified two students for Nationals and made it to the team competition for the region.
5. The competition is in Greenwood, SC and the students need pay for transportation (gas) and pay a registration fee to enter as well as the membership fee for the conference.

THEREFORE, be it resolved by Campus Union, that \$323.79 be given to the WoCo Wake Riders to allow the team to compete in the tournament.

WHEREAS:

1. Wofford Neuroscience Program students are an interdisciplinary body and deserve funding from Campus Union.

2. Wofford Neuroscience Program students have not yet received funding from Campus Union

3. Wofford Neuroscience Program students are in need of funding to experience a once in a life time opportunity to learn about the human body and its nervous system through the temporary Body Worlds exhibit at Discovery Place
