From the registrar's office

Registration for the 2020 spring semester will be held Nov. 5-8. Registration will open at 7:30 a.m. each day.

- Seniors (90 or more hours) will register on Tuesday, Nov. 5.
- Juniors (60-89 hours) will register on Wednesday, Nov. 6.
- Sophomores (30-59 hours) will register on Thursday, Nov. 7.
- First-years (less than 30 hours) will register on Friday, Nov. 8.

Students who have completed 80 hours and anticipate graduating during the 2019-20 academic year are required to complete the Graduation Application found under the Student section of myWofford. An email was sent to all potential applicants reminding them to complete this process. This Grad App information is used to order diplomas and is needed for the Commencement program. The Grad App process will close Nov. 15, 2019.

The drop/add period for Interim 2020 will open on Tuesday, Nov. 12, at 7:30 a.m., and it will close on Friday, Dec. 6, at midnight. Any changes after that date will require a visit to the registrar's office. Fees for courses dropped after Dec. 6 will not be refunded, and fees for the new course (if applicable) will be due. Fees are not transferable from the dropped course to the added course.
