As part of her senior Capstone Project, Environmental Studies major, Charlotte Perrow, hosted a Fall Food Festival at the Campus Life Building on November 11th. The event included eight vendors - Converse Deli, Palmetto Palate, Belue Farms, Parson's Produce, Hub City Co-op, Hub City Market, Native Meats, and the SC Dept of Agriculture.

According to Charlotte, "it was a great turnout supporting SC produce and local food. Hopefully students got to try some free carrots, pimento cheese sandwiches, tomato soup, and peach salsa. Thanks to everyone who came!"

The idea for the festival came as a result of Charlotte's experience working for the SC Department of Agriculture for two summers. "Originally, I wanted to start a real farmer's market on campus . . . I

think that this Fall Food Festival is a great transition to begin a market on campus that students, faculty, staff, and visitors could enjoy", says Charlotte.

About her experience, Charlotte summarizes, "I have learned how difficult is it putting an event together, but how willing vendors are to participate and get their names out to Wofford students. Local produce is so important to us as a society, and that is something that I have learned over the past couple of years . . . I hope Wofford students took that away from my project."
